Paso Basin Planting Ordinance Update

Background - Current Land Use Policy

- Agricultural Offset Requirements for the Paso Basin
 - Growers must maintain neutral water use on site based on a 5-year rolling lookback period
 - 5 AFY/site exemption allowed for unirrigated sites outside the area of severe decline
- August 27, 2013 Board authorized a version of these requirements through an Urgency Ordinance
- October 27, 2015 Board extended the requirements until adoption of the Groundwater Sustainability Plan (GSP)
- **November 5, 2019** Board extended the termination date to January 1, 2022

January 26, 2021 Board Direction

- Planning staff to develop a new land use policy to require planting permits for irrigated crops using water from the Paso Basin until 2045 with a 3-tiered framework:
 - **Tier 1** Exemption Clearance Permit for plantings using up to 25 AFY/site of irrigation
 - **Tier 2** Ministerial Permit for plantings maintaining neutral water use on site with a 6-year lookback period
 - **Tier 3** Discretionary Permit with CEQA review for plantings that do not fall under Tier 1 or Tier 2

January 26, 2021 Board Direction, Continued

- Planning staff to return ASAP (April 6, 2021) with:
 - Environmental Impact Report (EIR) contract
 - Updated estimated timeline
 - Budget augmentation request
 - More developed ordinance framework
