MEASURES SUBMITTED TO THE VOTERS

STATE

PROPOSITION 41 VETERANS HOUSING AND HOMELESS PREVENTION BOND ACT OF 2014. Authorizes \$600 million in general obligation bonds for affordable multifamily supportive housing to relieve homelessness, affordable transitional housing, affordable rental housing, or related facilities for veterans and their families. Fiscal Impact: Increased state bond costs averaging about \$50 million annually over 15 years.

WHAT'S NEW FOR THIS ELECTION

Something Has Changed!

All voters can now vote for all contests in the Primary Election, regardless of party preference.

Top Two Primary

To Summarize:

- There are no party-affiliated ballots in this election. Everyone votes the same ballot.
- You can vote for any candidate regardless of the candidate's party preference.
- The candidates who receive the highest and second-highest votes cast during the Primary election advance to the General election, even if the two candidates have the same party preference or both have no party preference.
- The Top Two Primary laws only pertain to federal, statewide, and state legislative offices: U.S. Congressional, statewide and state legislative offices. It does not affect non-partisan contests (i.e. counties, cities, school and special districts)

Write-In Candidates

Write-in candidates are eligible to run in the Primary, and voters can cast their vote for that candidate by writing in the candidate's name and filling in the oval next to the write-in line. If a qualified write-in candidate is one of the top two candidates, that candidate will advance to and have their name printed on the General election ballot. As a result, there will no longer be a Write-In line for Voter-Nominated contests during a November General election.

Party Preference and Political Party Endorsement

The term "party preference" is now used in place of "party affiliation." On the ballot, the political party preference, or no party preference, as indicated on the candidate's voter registration will be listed next to the candidate's name. The party designation is shown on the ballot for information to the voters only and it does not constitute or imply an endorsement by the party designated. Parties have provided a list of candidates for voter-nominated offices, who have received the official endorsement of the party for printing in this booklet.
