





BEHAVIORAL HEALTH REFORM PROPOSAL

GOVERNOR'S "TRANSFORMATION OF BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES"

1.Reforming the Mental Health Services Act to the Behavioral Health Services Act (SB326)

- "...expand services to include treatment for those with substance use disorders in addition to care
 for the most seriously mentally ill–provides more resources for housing and workforce, and
 continues community support for prevention, early intervention, and innovative pilot programs –all
 with new and increased accountability for outcomes and through an equity lens."
- Commits 3% of county allocations to "build a workforce to reflect and connect with California's diversity"

2. Focusing on outcomes, accountability, and equity

 "a new County Integrated Plan for Behavioral Health Services and Outcomes, including all local behavioral health funding and services."

3. Housing and behavioral health treatment in unlocked, community-based settings (AB531)

- A \$4.68 billion general obligation bond to build 10,000 new clinic beds and homes that would be on the March 2024 ballot.
- Housing for veterans with behavioral health challenges.



Behavioral Health Services Act (SB326)

Replaces Components with Four New "Buckets" for Assigning BHSA Allocations:

1. **Housing 30%**

- 50% for Housing Supports/Services, including outreach to encampments
 - Current bill focuses 50% on rental subsidies, shelter, etc.
- No more than 25% for Capital, including BH facilities to serve homeless

2. Full-Service Partnerships 35%

 Includes Assertive Community Treatment and Forensic Assertive Community Treatment "to fidelity"

3. BH Services and Supports 30%

• 50% must be spent on *early intervention*

4. Prevention 5%:

"population-based mental health and substance use disorder prevention"



Reform Model for San Luis Obispo County MHSA using FY 24-25 State Revenue Projection:

FY 24-25 Projected MHSA Allocation: \$20,581,919

- Subtract (-) 3% (\$617,458) off the top for statewide workforce projects = \$19,964,461
- **1. Housing 30% =** \$5,989,338
 - Current projected budget (programs that fit category): \$2,271,956
- 2. **Full-Service Partnerships 35% =** \$6,987,561
 - Current Projected Budget: \$6,709, 873
- 3. **BH Services and Supports 30% =** \$5,989,338
 - Current Budget Plan for Non-FSP (CSS, PEI, WET, CFTN): \$13,254,588
- **4. Prevention 5% =** \$998,223
 - Current projected budget (Prevention): \$1,508,679
