Arron – Grew up on Santa Rosa Creek Rd, cycling is his passion, started Cambria Bike Kitchen nonprofit. Gets kids on bikes. Looking forward to lending himself to this position – thank you/ honor to Red Davis who appointed him initially many years ago.

Kimberley – Comments about cyclist experience with her husband. Mentioned non-profit bike raffle, benefits go towards domestic violence awareness.

Kimberley – Comment about DMV involvement with driver / cyclist awareness. Met with senator Laird regarding making cyclist awareness/safety a larger part of DMV tests. Cyclist safety/ awareness needs to be a part of the driving test.

Skip – Bike related questions & guidance is on the test and pamphlet.

Jim – Thank you to County Public Works for improvements around Oceano Elementary!

6. COMMITTEE / STAFF REPORTS (10 minutes max; agendize lengthier items)

- A. County Public Works
 - i. Projects of Interest
 - -LOVR Corridor Study (to be presented)
 - -Buckley Road Corridor Study

Jake – Board meeting on Aug 22nd item will be consolidating all funding and settlement agreements. Essentially the funding package for the corridor plan.

Lea – Is that consent?

Jake – Yes, only for funding package approval.

B. CHP

Patrik – February to Today [August 8th]: Provided update on Templeton CHP collisions involving cyclists.

Skip – please email me the crash info so I can present it to SLOCOG in October. We are trying to connect bike related injuries to collision reports.

- C. Caltrans not present
- D. Air Pollution Control District

Andy- working on CEQA guidelines for greenhouse gasses based on CalEEMod. Tool that is used to evaluate new land use development and air quality/ greenhouse gas impacts from those developments. We then use our CEQA data to determine if there is a need for mitigation. A new tool has been imbedded into CalEEMod that provides mitigation measures and benefits, these are generally bike related (example bike lanes, bike parking). We will be using this tool to better quantify these mitigation measures.

Skip—I'm looking forward to seeing how Bike Lanes help with air. What does the increased temp do for air quality? **Andy**—Hotter the temperature higher the Ozone levels. State is in the process of reevaluating the Ozone standards, this will probably throw out our attainment depending on how much they lower it... We are partnering with SLOCOG on a VMT mitigation bank. SB 743 asking new development to reduce VMT by 15% relative to Countywide averages. Applied for CALTRANS Sustainable Transportation grant and was awarded. Now in the process of evaluating proposals from two different consulting firms. Part of mitigation measures are bicycle related like adding lanes and will be quantified within modules and tools if we do fund the mitigations.

Skip – comment about electric busses and how they affect VMT.

Andy - APCD is funding three electric busses and working with RTA and SLO Transit to install chargers.

Arron – How does the 15% reduction in VMT affect places like Cambria where consumer resources are limited? **Andy** – It's based on a bank/exchange system. Some projects can contribute while other projects can draw from the bank.

Jake – VMT mitigation banking or exchange programs are designed to help rural communities develop. Allows for offset so that development is feasible in these rural areas.

E. County Parks

Shaun – <u>Bob Jones Pathway</u>: working through construction documents. Board item to be taken on August 22nd to extend consultant services to get through 90% construction. Fully funded with ATP grant totaling \$18.25 million. Construction planned for 2025. Negotiating for easements, ROW is working on it.

<u>Morro Bay to Cayucos</u> – \$7 million ATP grant, working through Coastal development permit process. Starting construction in FY 24/25.

<u>Templeton to Atascadero town connector</u> – change scope to over the railroad. Meeting with Templeton CSD to discuss realignment of the project. Environmental to be updated. New ATP grant application in 24/25

Andy – Similar to scale of the Jennifer st bridge?

Shaun - Yes very similar

Lea - How did you get the railroad to negotiate with going over?

Shaun – Time, their policies changed, and it was the only thing they would consider.

Lea – This is great news, thank you!

F. County Planning & Building - not present

G. SLOCOG

John Dinunzio – award from state Trade Corridor Program, Pismo congestion relief project to put in a 3rd managed lane on Hwy 101 from Avila Beach Drive to Pismo. \$65 million award from the state to build that lane. We will be extending Shell Beach pathway from Shell Beach to Avila Beach Drive as a part of the project package.

Jim – Who will design the path?

John Dinunzio – The city of Pismo will lead this project and the design. Salud Carbajal earmarked \$800K for preliminary work for Edna Valley trail from Tank Farm up 227 for trial improvements. Idea is to build this path in conjunction with the intersection improvements along the 227. Avila Beach Drive improvements with roundabout to go out to construction very soon. New roundabout with shared parking, park n ride, and solar parking.

Jim – is Pismo working with county on the design of Shell Beach trail? Where will it go to?

John D–Yes, they are working together. The trail will connect where the roundabout/improvements are planned for. *Passes out cards for US 101 North County corridor master plan* US 101 North County Corridor plan covers from top of the Cuesta Grade to San Miguel and will be looking at everything up and down the corridor. Will also include the 46 East to Jardine Rd because of the city of Paso Robles development. Next Thursday August 17th meeting in Paso Robles for Union rd overcrossing will be reviewing environmental documents. Working on regional safety plan policy to go to board in October for "a road to zero" essentially a vision zero policy – zero roadway injuries/deaths by 2050. October 4th is SLO Safe Streets Safety Forum at Ludwick Center. Shortfall for transportation revenue for county so SLOCOG is looking to put measure on ballot for generating funds for infrastructure.

Skip – Sales Tax initiative: comprehensive package regarding the tax revenue – try to make it broad so everyone thinks they get a piece of it for their local traffic issues. Can we get another 5-year data from hospitals for bike related injuries and collisions?

John D – emergency services will be presenting at SLO Safe Streets and showing all the ambulance data.

Jeff Bartel - how much tax increase?

John D- we would expect about \$32-35 million, estimating a quarter cent for x amount of years. We have done 10 years in the past but could do 20 years.

Andy - SLOCOG did a great job on the past ballot for the sales tax, very close to passing. This tax is vital for infrastructure and development.

Skip – When can I get the Bikeways Plan Updated or switch to an ATP plan?

John D - You should ask the county to request funding from SLOCOG in the Fall.

Lea - Question about Shell Beach - will project eliminate existing Class 2 bike lane?

John D – That is a great question, this project is very new/young so that is something to being up.

Jim – my understanding is that the trail will be more of a multi-use path.

H. BAC Chairperson

Reminder: BAC Chair and Vice Chair elections in November

Skip – reminder that my term as chair ends next meeting, I can be vice chair or there can be two new. Diablo Cyn draft EIR, send ideas for how that property should be used for bike use within 1 week. Now is the time to act. **Chuck** – It is a lengthy document - the executive summary is a great place to start/ finish.

7. PRESENTATIONS (10-12 minutes max)

A. Bob Jones Trail – Avila Beach Resort Improvements

Chuck Stevenson – Brief introduction to project

Rob Rossi (presenter) – Began presentation with history of Avila Beach Resort: The resort was a part of Reyes Estate and planned for an 1100 units mobile home park, 160 were built. Mixed use of residential/commercial. Today there is roughly 900 homes. County general plan from 1981 that a trail would be put there but there was no definition about the trail. In 1988/89 there was discussion about what the trail should be. The path requirements and sizing has greatly changed and fluctuated over the years. There is new construction taking place (135 units for hotel and 12 small cabins/hostiles) at the resort that may affect the alignment of the path. Total of 24 low-cost

accommodations (less than \$100/night).

Chuck – going through coastal permit process. Policy is you must provide 25% low coast based of your highest seasonal rate unit. In this case you are providing to this low cost. This is very appealing to the coastal commission.

Rob Rossi – Hostiles are size of large house, about 3600 sq ft. Cabins/Hostiles are completely off grid except for the bathrooms. Rerouting the trail would be the best option and the trail would be a class 1. We will be installing an area for electric carts, bike storage, and full-time maintenance person.

Jim – How are your residents going to access everything?

Rob - They can use the existing or built paths as everyone else.

Jim – Will parking on Avila Beach Drive change at all? There's so much parking it makes cycling difficult due to people blocking / impacting the lane.

Rob – It'll be hard to get rid of that many parking spaces. For part of the year its packed and other times it isn't.

Skip – The previous trail width requirement was 8ftn now the trail does not meet updated requirements of 12ft.

The trial corridor would connect San Luis Obispo to Bob Jones Trail – this is a through transportation route. The trail should not go through rentals/buildings. The day-to-day usage if the trail/road needs to be taken care of. This is a heavily used road for vehicles and cyclists. Currently not being used as a multiuse trail.

Rob – We did look at different options at first. We could use part of the golf course but that's the only way we could do it.

Skip – Cutting through would eliminate the blind curve.

Gary – Where do private property rights come in?

Rob – We like the trail going through the property. Part of walking/cycling and the other side of the trail was equestrian.

Skip – The bike trail in Sacramento / Parkway Plan was going to have 4 different facilities with nowhere to put it all. They ended up widening a class 1 facility so that all could use. To eliminate conflict between pedestrians and bikes – peds walk on left and can move over onto the shoulder if needed. Trails must be wide enough for emergency vehicles and maintenance vehicles.

Lea – Where is this in County planning process?

Rob – In EIR, currently waiting to review environmental documents. Expect to go into hearing next year. Zoned recreations, visitor serving, and hotel.

Lea – concern with parking and who owns the parking in Avila/ Avila Beach Drive. Is it the port?

Rob – The county owns the road.

Lea – There is an issue with people parking and blocking/ affecting bike lanes. Can the County prohibit parking or regulate parking during certain days of the week? Will you bring this back once EIR is out?

Rob – We had proposed 10 years ago to reduce the parking along Avila Beach Drive and redirect it to a parking lot supplied by UniCal. They were in favor of that then.

Kimberly – Will electric bikes/ motorized vehicles be prohibited on the trail?

Rob – We do not have the authority to regulate that. Residents can use golfcarts on some parts of the trail.

Lea – Is part of the trail-maintained HOA?

Rob – We own the fee, then there is an easement to the HOA that is not exclusive and then there is an easement granted to the County. HOA did not like the County Easement at first.

Chuck – in conclusion we would like some feedback / discussion from your committee to the County staff person. We will be coming back for another presentation.

B. Introduction to the LOVR Corridor Study – Jake Hudson

Jake — This is a kickoff presentation to the LOVR Corridor Plan. Background: 4 different adopted plans over the years currently trying to better define and reconcile plans. Scope: from Foothill blvd to State Park, main point of interest: Eto Lane to Rodman Drive. Timeline: Project initiation — now public outreach campaign, draft complete in Spring 2024, and BOS Summer 2024. Public engagement: through interactive website, reaching out to LOCAC, BAC, press release, farmers market appearance, and signage along the corridor. Will be working with various agency partners (we have not formally met yet).

Kimberly: Thank you Jake for sharing this with us. The committee really appreciates the communication.

Lea: Thank you for doing this. LOVR is heavily traveled by cyclists. Which farmers market?

Jake: Baywood/Los Osos on Monday from 2-4pm.

Lea: What is the status of the resurfacing? Will it go to Foothill, was it on hold due to storms?

Jake: I cannot speak to the resurfacing project but, the County did have to completely reconstruct due to the major damage from the storm.

Lea: Request for future agenda item: what projects have been set aside due to the storm efforts.

Skip: between Foothill to South Bay, we have an 8 ft shoulder. The shoulder is deteriorating, and county practice has been to only resurface the vehicular lane. We want complete roadwork from edge to edge. Past South Bay blvd there is a constraint with width- is there a possibility for a version of a class 2 bikeway?

Jake: we will be getting to design level, surveying road and creating a design.

Skip: Is there a consensus for me to write a letter to the County for funding request.
