Hi Brendan.

I wanted to provide some additional information and clarity on the project status ahead of next week's meeting.

Our project includes three components, and the priority for project funding is as follow:

- 1. The highest priority is the SLT Booster Pump Station component. This is a new booster pump station to improve inadequate pressure and fire flow in the distribution system.
- 2. The second priority is the SLT Tank Replacement component. This project component is to replace an undersized and poor condition tank with a new 250,000 gallon tank.
- 3. The third priority is the pipeline replacement component. This project component is to replace aging and undersized pipelines.

The answers to questions 1-3 below are the same for each project component. However, I did want to provide some clarity on questions 4 and 5 for the different components:

- 4) What is the status of the design of the project? Some conceptual design has been completed for the SLT
 Booster Pump Station and Tank Replacement component of the project. Attached is the conceptual site layout.
 Additional funding is needed to further the design. No design has not been started for the pipeline replacement
 component at this time.
 - a. What % plans are complete? The SLT Booster Pump Station and Tank Replacement component are at 5% design. The pipeline replacement component is at 0%.
- 5) Is there any change to the status of legal access / easements for the project, if applicable? No, however we have a call with the County next week to discuss the process of obtaining the proposed site for the SLT Booster Pump Station and Tank site that is located in the County's right of way. We are moving forward with securing that site.

A few status updates notes and questions for you to respond to in the next few days.

Status & Schedule Update:

- The Working Group is preparing for their upcoming meeting to recommend a suite of projects to move ahead in the application process.
- This meeting is scheduled for Thursday, August 24th at 10am. We will be meeting in the conference room of the SLO City/County Library.
 - Your attendance is not required
- It is anticipated that the Working Group will recommend 3-5 projects for the application. From there, the schedule is anticipated to be:
 - RWMG, September 7th, 10am: The RWMG will be expected to vote to recommend this suite of projects to the Board of Supervisors.
 - WRAC, October 5th, 1:30pm: The WRAC will vote whether or not to recommend the suite of projects to the Board.
 - o Board of Supervisors, Nov 8 or Dec 6, 9am: the BOS will consider authorizing the Director of Public works to file the application or not.
 - o Application is due February 1, 2023 to DWR.
