DR. GLEN MILLER PUBLIC HEALTH LABORATORY	 The lab is seeing increases in respiratory illnesses as well as variant JN.1. This is the most common and makes up 19.4% of cases in SLO County. We expect an increase of this variant as it is more transmissible, however not as severe. We are also monitoring cases of influenza. H1N1 currently makes up 83% of cases in the county. Our sequencing platform is being updated. This will help us link and identify cases more efficiently.
JESSIE BURMESTER PUBLIC HEALTH EPIDEMIOLOGIST	 A new respiratory diseases dashboard is expected to launch February 1st. This dashboard will showcase three pathogens for wastewater sites. It will also show the number of vaccinations and number of deaths in relation to the pathogens.
SCOTTY JALBERT OFFICE OF EMERGENCY SERVICES (OES)	 The Disaster Preparedness Advisory Council meeting will take place on February 22nd. We are preparing an Ingestion Pathway drill through the Nuclear Power Plant program. This will be a three-day, FEMA evaluated exercise taking place from July 31st to August 2nd with a pre-drill/dress rehearsal in June. OES is working on an Emergency Operations update. We are launching an Alert SLO program, hopefully by the end of the year. This will be a notification system to report lesser incidents, such as highway shutdowns.
PETER HAGUE ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH	 Environmental Health is currently performing standard business and supporting restaurant inspections. Nothing unusual to report.
FRANK WARREN BEHAVIORAL HEALTH	 There has been a change in leadership in County Behavioral Health with myself (Frank Warren) as the new Deputy Director and Star Graber as Director. With this change we are reevaluating disaster plans and contracts for facilities.
	 We are working on establishing a sobering center and psychiatric urgent care at the Health Agency campus. Possibly launching this center in July.
