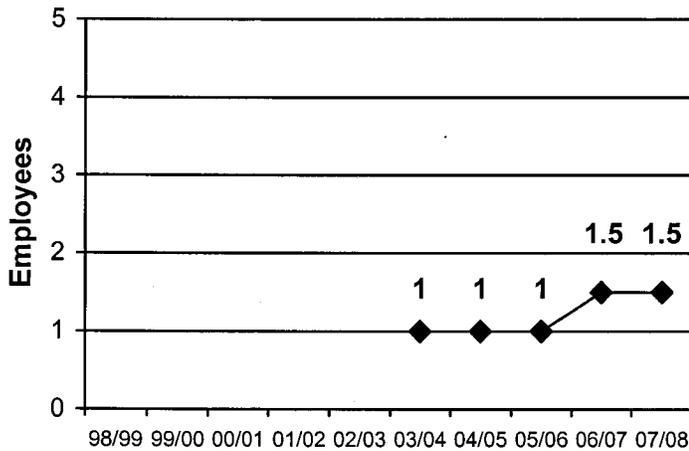


MISSION STATEMENT

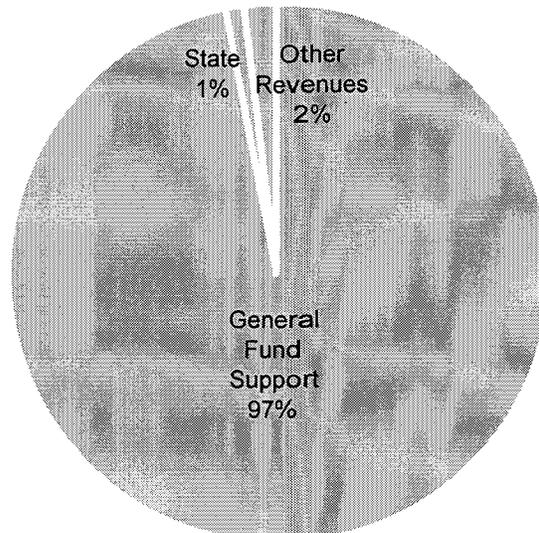

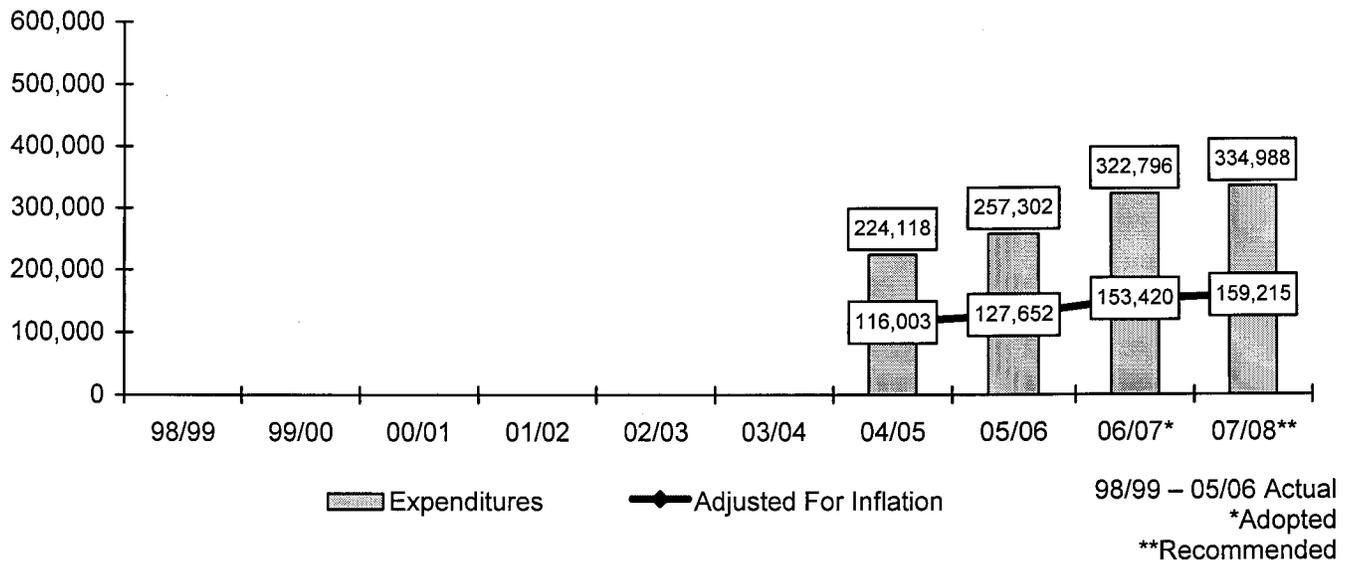
Number of Employees

DEPARTMENT COMMENTS

The Suspected Abuse Response Team (SART) provides medical forensic services for suspected sexual assault, suspected acute or chronic sexual abuse, and physical abuse, upon request from local, state agencies, and northern Santa Barbara County agencies. Specifically trained SART staff performs the mandated medical-legal exams. The SART staff is an integral part of a criminal investigation by the law enforcement agencies and/or investigation requested by Child Welfare Services. The SART Advisory Board acts as a supportive and advisory body to the SART Medical Director to assist in unifying efforts, accountabilities, and responsibilities of all SART member agencies through a multidisciplinary and collaborative approach.

COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR'S COMMENTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Very little has changed in this requested and recommended budget as compared to FY 2006-2007. Staffing remains the same (a 0.5 nurse was added in FY 2006-2007) and the increases in expenses are attributable to prevailing wage increases granted to employees and pension rate increases. Services and supplies are recommended to increase by approximately \$10,000 or 9% and the primary reason is an increase in insurance charges.
