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**INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING
THE NOTICE OF INTENT
TO APPLY RESTRICTED MATERIALS
(FORM PR-ENF-126X)**

A Notice of Intent must be submitted to the Agricultural Commissioner's office at least 24 hours before the applications of a restricted pesticide. See Permit Condition 11 for submission of the Notice of Intent.

Nursery

Nursery: Check if you are a nursery.

#1

County Number: San Luis Obispo County is Number 40.

#2, 3, 4

Section, Township, Range: This information is found on your restricted materials permit under each site number. Enter the correct number in each box and be sure to circle the appropriate direction letters for the township and range.

#5

Base & Meridian (this information is found on your restricted materials permit under each site number): Circle M if your township = S and range = E. Circle S if your township = N and range = W.

#6

Application Method: Check appropriate box. If the application is by ground rig, check "Ground." If by aircraft, check "Air." If neither applies, check "Other", which includes fumigation, chemigation, gopher control, hand or backpack sprayers.

#7

Permittee/Property Operator: Enter the complete name of the permittee or property operator as it appears on the permit.

#8

Operator ID/Permit Number: This information is found on the restricted materials permit on the upper right hand corner. Be sure all eleven digits are entered, eg. 40-93-4020504.

- #9 Site ID Number:** This information is found on the restricted materials permit and/or permit map. If the site being treated is nonproduction, i.e. Non-crop, a site identification number will not have been assigned, therefore leave blank (see box #11).
- #10 Total Planted Acres/Units:** Enter total planted acres at the site entered in Box #9. Planted acres must not exceed the amount in box #15 or the total acres as listed on the restricted materials permit. If nonproduction, i.e. Non-crop, put "N/A."
- #11 Location:** If the site being treated is nonproduction, i.e. Non-crop, enter the ranch and plot (if plot is applicable) as assigned on the permit map. Otherwise leave blank.
- #12 Block ID:** This is used for vineyards that are divided into blocks.
- #13 Applicator Name and Address:** Enter the name and address of the hired person or company making the application. If done by employee of permit holder enter the name or ranch name as is shown on the restricted materials permit.
- #14 Proposed Dates/Time Applied:** Enter the date (time is not required) you intend to start the application. The Agricultural Commissioner must receive the Notice of Intent at least 24 hours before starting. You have four days from the proposed date (Box #14) to start the application. If you do not perform the application within the four day allowance you are required to submit a "No Use" pesticide use report. If you wish to reschedule the application for a later date you are required to file a new Notice of Intent at least 24 hours prior to starting the application. For spot treatment applications of strychnine or aluminum phosphide for rodent control, you may enter the entire or portion of the month, i.e. April 10th - 30th, 1993. For these monthly notices, a Notice of Intent is still required at least 24 hours before starting.
- #15 Proposed Total Acres/Units Treated:** Enter the total acreage or units to be treated. If other than acreage, list the units, i.e. square feet, cubic yards. This may be less than the total planted acres at that site. For spot treatment list total acres or units to be treated. For example, if you have 50 acres to spot treat enter the total 50 acres even though you will only treat a portion of the 50 acres.
- #16 Commodity/Site Treated:** This information is found on your restricted materials permit. Be sure the commodity or site is also on the pesticide label.
- #17 Chemical Number:** Leave blank.
- #18 Manufacturer/Name of Product Applied:** Enter the brand and trade name of the pesticide product being applied. Include the concentration and type of formulation if the information is included as part of the trade name. For example: *DiazinonAG500/Helena, Botran 75W/Nor-Am, Treflan 5/Elanco, etc.

- #19 EPA/California Registration Number from Label:** Each pesticide product has been assigned an EPA Registration Number or California Registration Number that appears on the label. Indicate this number for each pesticide used. Do not use the EPA Est. Number.
- #20** N/A
- #21 Rate:** Enter the recommended rate from the pesticide label. For example, 1/2 pint/acre, 3 pounds/acre or 2-4 tablets/burrow. If rate is given in teaspoons, then convert to ounces where possible.
- #22 Dilution:** Enter recommended dilution from the pesticide label, i.e. how much water will you add or the total volume of spray material per acre. Example: 50 gallons water/acre. If no dilution put N/A.
- #23 Target Pest:** List the target pest you are attempting to control, i.e. ground squirrel, aphid, broadleaf weeds.
- #24 Days Reentry:** From the pesticide label and/or California Code of Regulations Section 6770, 6772 and 6774, if applicable.
- #25 Days Preharvest:** From the pesticide label.
- #26 Applied/Supervised by:** Indicate the name of the person who applied the pesticide and the person responsible for supervising an application by an employee.
- #27 Environmental Changes/Comments:** Indicate any environmental changes at the site since the restricted materials permit was issued which may result in areas being adversely affected by the application. This may be shown by using the box to the right (adjacent crops, schools, dwellings, etc.).

Sign, date and enter the PCA name if applicable.

Leave bottom boxes blank - for office use only.

Submit the top blue copy to the Agricultural Commissioner and maintain the goldenrod copy for 2 years.
