**RESTRICTED MATERIAL PERMIT CONDITION 4
AVITROL FOR FERAL BIRD CONTROL**

1. GENERAL

- a. A pre-application site inspection shall be made by the Agricultural Commissioner's staff prior to the use of this pesticide.
- b. If the structure where Avitrol will be applied is a commercial building, the owner of the building and all tenants must receive notification prior to the application taking place.
- c. You must contact and inform the following agencies, about your application, at least 24 hours prior to the use of Avitrol:

- d. We recommend you contact and inform local veterinarians, nearby businesses, and residences about your application. These contacts may help if people find dead birds in surrounding areas. The Agricultural Commissioner's staff may require these notifications after evaluation of the site, during the pre-application site inspection.

2. PREBAITING

- a. Prebait shall be untreated grain of the same composition as the Avitrol carrier.
- b. Avitrol shall not be applied to sites where target birds are not actively feeding, as established by the prebaiting procedure. A minimum of 80% of the prebait shall be consumed before treated bait is used.

3. BAITING

- a. When Avitrol is used near public areas, the application shall be timed so that bird exposure symptoms coincide with the time of least public activity.
- b. Monitoring of the site after baiting and during the period that bird symptoms occur is required. Dead birds shall be picked up and disposed of as soon as possible.
- c. At the end of each day, uneaten treated grain shall be picked up and secured in a container with proper service container labeling, pursuant to Section 6678 of the California Code of Regulations.
