Current County Updates:

- Animal Shelter- moving forward, abandoned animals need to be taken care of. To re-build the building a new location is being determined. Cities are also contributing to the costs approved of 10mill.
- New positions being added to the County
- 39 Mill of funds are going to road fee's
- Self help County- the State will match funds raised
- Tourist marketing district fee assessed on people that stay overnight. \$1.00 for every \$100. Funds will be used to brand the County, the goal is to increase businesses
- Airport Terminal- will allow for more and travel agencies, new services to airport are 90% paid by FAA grants
- Water Issues- different in all counties. 22 Basins in county, an ordinance was passed to make it difficult for people to sell their water
- De-Sal Water- spoke with PG&E to use De-Sal water in case of an emergency, 1 mill/ mile to transport the water.
- Ban on synthetic drugs- death in North County, banned the use of synthetic drugs in SLO County.
- Homeless shelter crisis declared- freeze some County funds to support the shelter.
- Behavioral Health Facility- Templeton facility approves unanimously.
- Jack's Helping hand facility- for both children and adults is progressing with kitchen and accessible bathrooms.
- Trilogy- Assisted living facility, medical type facility for elders to live in. 110 Beds, staff on board to transfer people.
- Affordable housing- is a huge issue in SLO County, 77% of land is Agricultural or open space that cannot have housing built on.
- H2A program in Ag- temporary workers agree to housing 6 months out of the year.
