Adult Protective Services protects elder adults (ages 65 and older) and dependent adults (any person age 18 to 64 with a physical or mental limitation). Adult abuse is abuse by another (physical, neglect, abandonment, etc.) and self neglect (physical care, medical care, financial, etc.).

Mandated reporters are by law any person who assumes the responsibility for care or custody of elder or dependent adult, whether or not that person receives compensation, or not. Reporting duties are individual. The name of the reporter is kept confidential. Failure to report is a misdemeanor which is six months in jail and/or \$1000 fine. If great bodily injury or death occurs it is 12 months in jail and/or \$5000 fine. Any person who is not a mandated reporter can make a report and their name is kept confidential. You can make a report by calling the 24-Hour Line 1-844-729-8011 or by written report (within two working days) [[cdss.ca.gov/cdssweb/entres/forms/English/soc341.pdf](http://cdss.ca.gov/cdssweb/entres/forms/English/soc341.pdf)]. You can report abuse to the community to APS (805) 781-1790 or Law Enforcement. APS investigates, cross report to law enforcement, and provides services. They are designed to help in the short term, not long term. The goal is to be safe at home. APS can make referrals to the Public Guardian for conservatorship. APS provides the following services: Emergency response, In-Home protection, temporary protective services, case management, and multidisciplinary personnel team consultation.

**APS Services are voluntary.**

Population in San Luis Obispo is #17 in California with fastest growing senior population. Victims can be embarrassed or ashamed. The victim may depend on the abuser for care. The victim may be afraid of retaliation and loss of independence. Victims are usually women 75 and older, usually live with the abuser, dependent on others. Effective on July 1, 2015 APS will be handling all APS After Hours Calls and using Structured Decision Making Tool on all incoming referrals. In an emergency, dial 911. APS can also go out and give presentations about mandated reporting training.
