Be a Precinct Worker!

San Luis Obispo County is known for conducting open and honest elections, built on security and integrity. Join our team!

The County of San Luis Obispo employs approximately 1000 precinct workers per election to work at the polls. Precinct workers play an integral part by assisting every qualified voter to cast a ballot and ensuring each ballot is safely secured until it can be counted.

Precinct workers are responsible for providing a positive voting experience and ensuring the rights of everyone seeking to vote are protected.

Being a precinct worker is a very important and challenging job. It is also a very rewarding job. It fosters a sense of civic responsibility, allows you to see our Country's democratic process in action and you earn extra money in the process!

Eligibility Requirements

Are you:

- ⊗ 18 yrs old or older
- ⊗ A U.S. citizen
- ⊗ A registered voter in the State of California

- ⊗ Able to speak and read English
- ⊗ Available to serve from 6:30 am to 9-9:30m pm on election day & have adequate transportation

Positions, Duties & Pay

Each Precinct has an Inspector and 3 to 4 workers making up the Precinct Board.

Under the direction of a Precinct Assistant, Inspectors are responsible for workers assigned to them, attending training; picking up supplies and contacting the polling place, if necessary

All workers help setup the polling place before the polls open, assist voters in all phases of the voting process, receive ballots, and close the polls.

- ⊗ Clerks, Voter Assistance clerks & Voting System Specialists are paid \$97 for the full day or \$48.50 for ½ day.
- ⊗ Inspectors are paid \$117 plus pay for picking up supplies and coordinating with the polling place, if necessary.

Training

All workers are paid to attend training. Training sessions are available at various times and locations throughout the county in the month preceding the election. Inspectors are required to attend. All other workers are strongly *encouraged to attend*. You will be trained in Voter's rights, cultural sensitivity, Election Day procedures and how to assist voter's with disabilities.
