

**ORDINANCE NO. 3275**

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 2 OF THE SAN LUIS OBISPO COUNTY CODE,  
ADMINISTRATIVE AND PERSONNEL, SECTION 2.24.010, RELATING TO THE ISSUANCE OF GENERAL PLAN CONFORMITY  
REPORTS CONSISTENT WITH GOVERNMENT CODE SECTIONS 65401 AND 65403**

The Board of Supervisors of the County of San Luis Obispo ordains as follows:

SECTION 1: Section 2.24.010 of Title 2 of the San Luis Obispo County Code, is hereby amended as follows:

**2.24.010 Creation—Establishment.**

A county planning commission in and for the county is established and created under and by the authority of Chapter 1800, Statutes of 1965, state of California, as required by Title 7, Chapter 3 of the Government Code. The planning commission, together with the board of supervisors and the department of planning and building, are designated as the "planning agency" of the county pursuant to section 65100 of the Government Code. The department of planning and building is designated to be the planning agency for the purpose of issuing conformity reports pursuant to Government Code section 65402. The board of supervisors is designated to be the planning agency for the purpose of issuing conformity reports pursuant to Government Code sections 65401 and 65403, paragraph(c).

SECTION 2. This project is covered by the general rule that the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment (Government Code 15061(b)(3). It can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that this project may have a significant effect on the environment because no new development is authorized, no increase in density will occur, no change in allowed uses is proposed or authorized and no physical change to the environment will occur. Therefore the activity is not subject to CEQA.

SECTION 3. If any section, subsection, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the decision of a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of the remaining portion of this ordinance. The Board of Supervisors hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance and each section, subsection, clause, phrase or portion thereof irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses, phrases or portions be declared invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 4: Before the expiration of 15 days after the adoption of this ordinance by the San Luis Obispo County Board of Supervisors, it shall be published once in a newspaper of general circulation published in the County of San Luis Obispo, State of California, together with the names of the members of the Board of Supervisors voting for and against the ordinance.
