1. **Introductions, announcements, critical issues and additions to the agenda**
Chair Jim Salio called the meeting to order at 1:30 PM. Introductions were made around the room.

Lisa Fraser announced she will be partnering with Santa Barbara and Ventura County will be sharing hosting duties for the Evidenced Based Program and Intervention training in Buellton on Friday, January 14, 2011. Educating people on what is evidenced based is.

4. **Information/Discussion Items**

Daytime Curfew Ordinance – Jim Salio passed out a “draft” of the ordinance amending chapter 7.22 (curfew for minors) of the San Luis Obispo County Code. This ordinance only affects unincorporated areas of the county, sets the precedents to have city ordinances drawn up. County Council has already reviewed and made changes to the ordinance which amends the nighttime curfew to include the daytime curfew. Daytime curfew – declaration of intent is located on page 4, Section 7.22.080. Collaborators on the ordinance were Jim Salio, Probation, Pat Hedges, Sheriff's Dept and Gerald Shea, DA's office. They have met with all five of the San Luis Obispo County Board of Supervisors individually to discuss the ordinance and are now ready for it to be presented to the Board of Supervisor, February or March time frame, pending its review from the CSN. CSN would like 2-3 Superintendents there when Jim Salio and Julian Crocker present, maybe also have Gerald Shea and Ian Parkinson attend as well. Jim Salio will finalize the document with County Council and move forward before the County Board of Supervisors.

Tri-County Regional Service Provider Website – Jim Salio reported his department is working with Marcie Powers the Anti-Gang Commission as well as Mike Madlock, a retired Oxnard police officer, who is overseeing a Technical Assistance Grant that was given to the Tri-County Region (Santa Barbara, Ventura and San Luis Obispo County) for an Anti Gang confidential website that shares information amongst law enforcement. A regional website for providers is a second site being looked into which providers can provide what programs they offer, what grants they are going after and what grants they are aware of; a networking for providers where access can be controlled by being password protection. Jim Salio thinks if San Luis Obispo County wanted to participate, CSN would be the best agency to take the lead, with Mike Madlock coordinating all the logistics between Ventura and Santa Barbara County. No initial cost but if later it has been discovered there is costs to be incurred it will be brought back and discussed before the group. A third website, would access Community information, a website for the community. Jim Salio will speak with Reva on the details if CSN would like to move forward on this; unanimous consent.

CANS Update – Jon Nibbio reported he, Brad Sunseri and Mark Haas traveled to San Francisco in November to see how the program was working and met with staff. They learned from San Francisco that having one standard assessment that multi agencies could work off of also made it easier for the family, was helpful when cases moved from one employee to another, and having a common language. Brad Sunseri reported they are working with an IT contractor to put all needed applications on the system or either intergraded into. Timeframe to be in place is estimated to be 6-9 months.

Partnership for Excellence in Family Support – Lisa Fraser reported this organization's purpose is to leverage resources, funding support and to integrate services for families and communities they serve throughout SLO County. Collaboratively sharing opportunities, rather than independently, on funding. Historically, many organizations apply for money without communicating with one another. A Business Plan is being completed to determine support.

Addition of 0-5 in the SAFE System of Care - Lisa Fraser referred to the 0-5 Logic Model handout which 0-5 year age group is not getting the coordinated approach that school age children and youth get. San Luis Obispo, North and South County resource groups have been addressing the infrastructure to collaborate on the services this age group needs. SAFE Soc representatives have been approached to expand and include 0-5 age group as opposed to coming up with another system of care. Should Martha's Place be under the CSN or should it be discussed outside the group. Many do not want it to be under the County but to share the responsibility with groups yet to be determined. If funding goes away, it would be First 5 that would be responsible for services most needed for this age group.
