Information/Discussion Item: Election

Equine Alliance presentation.

The Equine Alliance works with at risk youth in teaching them how to care for and work with horses. The benefits are that the children learn about relating, relationship building, trust, and delayed gratification. In addition, the youth are taught to learn self control and anger management skills as they bond with animals that have been rescued from potentially abusive situations. Lee Collins questioned confidentiality of their use of participant photos and personal stories. The Equine Alliance acknowledge the error and stated that they would remove photos and edit any anecdotal information that may jeopardize the confidentiality of participating youth.

Information/Discussion Item:

Coordinated Response

Given current trends, incidents and recent tragedies, Jim Roberts and Jon Nibbio from The Family Care Network requested the Board consider forming a planned coordinated response to youth who make a threat of harm to a person or entity. Ian Parkinson suggested that we work cautiously, but he agreed that educating the public is a good idea. It was suggested that perhaps we can develop training to determine when and what appropriate response to take. Gerry Shea suggested we consider forming a "break away" committee to include County Counsel and explore this topic further.

Jill Bolster-White would like to see other "outside" agencies included in this committee. Jeff Hamm stated that he would research Behavioral Health's policy and reach out to County Counsel. Perhaps he may solicit County Counsel to give a presentation on the subject at a future meeting.

Information/Discussion Item:

South County SAFE Status

Melinda Sokolowski of CAPSLO explained that due to contract issues with FRC, SAFE sites would not be opening at the Oceano location, nor at Nipomo DSS. In addition, Lucia Mar has struggled to meet the needs of special needs students, and as a result, some programs have been cut. Resolving this issue is a "work in progress" and no details have yet been finalized. With limited resources, the school district is moving toward utilizing an on-site therapist in an effort to serve a maximum number of students.
