1. Introductions, announcements, critical issues and additions to the agenda
Co Chair Jim Salio called the meeting to order at 1:22 PM. Introductions were made around the room.

2. Public Comment
Biz Steinberg announced Community Action Partnership of SLO was awarded a Teen Pregnancy Prevention 5 year program of over \$400k.

Lisa Fraser announced SLO-CAP will be utilizing in 2011 Community Based Child Abuse Prevention (CBCAP) funds, by again sponsoring another series of Parent Leadership Development; Lisa shared a brochure for the committees review; the upcoming classes for 2011 will be held in San Miguel and Oceano.

Sue Warren gave an update regarding the medicine cabinet which was featured in the Tribune, as well as the Atascadero news paper, in which the one time promotion took in 976 lbs of medication waste. The promotion was initiated by the Department of Justice that allowed you to bring in the expired prescriptions to the law enforcement offices or substations for disposal. J. Salio will look into fliers that could promote this ongoing benefit with Morro Bay Police Chief Tim Olivas; fliers could be given to doctor offices and therapists. Sue emailed Sheriff Hedges a flier of another Operation Medical Chest for November 15th it is another national promotion of medication disposal.

4. Information/Discussion Items
CSN/SLOCAP Discontinuing Quarterly Forum Update - Reva proposed to discontinue the CSN/SLOCAP quarterly forum meetings due to the dissipated participation of these forums; Reva and Lisa Fraser may have one solid topic a year that brings a large group of participants but otherwise scramble for the remainder of three (3) quarters for quality topics. J. Salio indicated that our by-laws do not require mandatory quarterly forums. Motion was made to hold a forum "as needed".

CSN Sponsorship of Forum for State Assembly Candidate – Julian Crocker indicated the forum happened on Monday, October 4, 2010; not well attended with 15 people attending.

Model of Care Oversight Committee for Martha's Place – Lisa Fraser gave an update for Mary Bianchi, who was not able to attend. Martha's Place is now being County administered; a group met to determine how Martha's Place can still have a community connection as well as serve the needs for children 0-5 yrs old. The thought was to have that connection through CSN or SAFE, the Management Support Team (MST); the info-structure is already there, there is no need to recreate a new one. MST meetings are quarterly, the 3rd Thursday of the month.

Methamphetamine Task Force Workgroup Discussion - J. Salio confirmed with the Committee the direction the Meth Task Force will go; in the beginning, the goal was dealing with meth exposed children and to keep children & families from being exposed to methamphetamine; the group agreed this is still the goal. The Meth Task Force will need to develop a base line with objectives for a Strategic Plan for reducing the meth exposed children in San Luis Obispo County. The Meth Task Force Workgroup list will be emailed to everyone one more time to ensure all agencies are represented for the first meeting.

Truancy & Dropout Strategic Plan Update – J. Salio reported that he, Gerry Shea and Pat Hedges met with CAO Jim Grant to discuss the Daytime Curfew Ordinance; Jim Grant thinks this is a great idea; Supervisor Mecham is also in support of this ordinance. Jim Salio is working with County Counsel's Rita Neal and Shannon Matuszewicz on the ordinance. J. Salio would like to present the San Luis Obispo County Board of Supervisors the progress of the Truancy & Dropout Strategic Plan and also have them adopt this Daytime Curfew Ordinance sometime after the first of the year.

J. Salio updated us on the Senate Bill 1317 which passed; any child between K – 8th grade that misses 10% or more of the school year is considered truant and a misdemeanor penal code will be levied against the parent/guardian effective Jan. 1, 2011.

CANS Assessment follow-up discussion - Jon Nibbio, as well as others, will meet with staff in San Francisco in early November to discuss their CANS Assessment pilot that is through their Child Welfare; San Francisco is using it with their foster kids with mental health issues; the group will observe and bring back information to discuss various agencies here whether or not we could do it here.

Lee Collins screened a video for the Child Welfare Staff called "10 Things: Your Child Needs Every Day" produced by the Kinship Center, intended to assist for grandparents taking care of their grandchildren and for parents getting their children back after being in Foster Care. Lee would like to offer the video for you and your staff to review; send him an email if you are interested. The video is in both English and Spanish. Julian Crocker offered to run the video on channel 19.
