Welcome & Introductions	Vice Chairperson Jason Reed called the meeting to order at 12:01 p.m. Introductions: Colin Rigley, New Times; Jason Nefores, SLO County Sheriff; Susan Warren, Health Commission; Lee Ann Smith, guest	
Public Comment	Sue W. announced that the Federal Parity Bill was signed by the President. John Lovern announced that Alcohol and Drug Counselors are now mandated reporters of child abuse. The Licensing bill was vetoed however.	
Approval of Minutes	The September 18, 2008 minutes were approved as written.	Motion made by Lanny Erikson; Second by Harry Sharp
DAAB Membership Recruitment	Headed by Dennis Palm (Absent)	Tabled. Continue on agenda next month.
County Budget Report	Kerry Bailey announced that the Board of Supervisors met Tuesday-Directed County Departments to offset lost State revenue; to implement budget reductions to cover the pay increase; and directed County Administrative Officer to maintain hiring process-- vacancies may not be filled.	
Administrator's Report	Dr. Graber spoke with Lee Ann and her membership is moving forward. Receipt of federal grant funding to provide services for co-occurring disorder clients in Proposition 36 Program. Three year STOP grant for underage drinking begins now; have not assigned staffing to the grant due to hiring process.	

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	Have finished with our grants, County received two or three grants. Dr. Graber is serving on Committee for State regarding certification of Alcohol & Drug Counselors.	
DAAB Bylaws	Jason reported that the Bylaws membership process is to be revised; got feedback from County Counsel; not drafted yet.	Jason Reed will have draft of revised bylaws for next DAAB meeting.
Education on Proposition 5 by Dr. Star Graber	<p>Handout provided on Non-violent Offender Rehabilitation Act (NORA); information from Voter Guide for consideration; qualified for Nov. 4 ballot as Proposition 5. Dr. Graber gave a presentation regarding highlights of NORA. What it does: revitalizes treatment; addresses prison overcrowding; reduces incarceration for minor offenses and prison time for participation in treatment in custody by prisoners; changes penalty for marijuana possession; creates a continuum of diversion programs (i.e., Track I-for PC1000 or DEJ; Track II-Prop 36; Track III-Drug courts) with separate funding and regulations for each track. NORA does provide a separate track for youth under 18; do not have to be referred by justice system. Tries to prevent revolving-door system; requires treatment; increases parole for violent offenders and makes them eligible for treatment services for one year after parole term; establishes state oversight commission consisting of 23 members appointed by Governor and Legislature with some at large members. Funding increases \$150 million statewide; based on population only; SLO estimate is \$3.3 million; new allocation would begin January 1, 2009 for planning and new clients would enter the program July 1, 2009.</p>	See Handout provided.
Dependency Court Program	Presented by Rebecca Patterson, Specialist IV at Drug and Alcohol Services for Dr. Joanne Smith; provided program handout; statistics are very good with 100% family reunification in 6 to 18 month program; less than 5% recidivism rate over 3 years. Dependency Drug Court is a comprehensive treatment program working hand in hand with the Court and Child Welfare Services to reunify families.
