### **1. Welcome and Introductions**

Michelle Shoresman welcomed the stakeholder representatives, reviewed agenda items to discuss, asked each person to introduce themselves and reminded everyone to sign in. As April 30 marked the end of open enrollment and special enrollment for Covered CA, this is a good time to summarize where we all are today and what issues we had. May Ly will do a slide presentation from Covered CA. She will show us some tools from the web site especially for the outreach and navigators. Since DSS was not able to send someone to the meeting today, I can take questions back to Pati Garcia after the meeting, if they arise. If you are not on our email list please feel free to put your email in the sign in sheet and will add you to the group.

### **2. Covered California Enrollment Data Handout**

Michelle shared a 14-page set of tables from Covered CA that shows different regions, counties and who had enroll in this past open enrollment period. It looks like this is people enrolled in a plan, not including M/C. You can see that the numbers are significantly smaller in the 2<sup>nd</sup> round of open enrollment than they were in the 1<sup>st</sup> enrollment period. (See attached.)

### **3. Round Table discussion**

Stats – In the short period that Public Health has been “up and running” as a Certified Enrollment Entity (CEE), we submitted 12 Covered CA applications and a little more than 20 Medi-Cal applications to date. Unfortunately, we are now down two of our three Certified Enrollment Counselors (CECs), Nora Kelly has accepted another position in Public Health and our contract with Catherine Thomas termed out. Susana Castañeda is our sole remaining CEC. We are recruiting for Nora’s position, which is currently posted as a Public Health Nurse, but we are hoping to find someone who also has experience as a health navigator. See attached flyer and share as you see appropriate.

We received a new grant from the state as a follow-up to our Medi-Cal Outreach and Enrollment grant, but the purpose of this grant is to assist existing Medi-Cal beneficiaries with re-enrollment.

The County is administering the grant and we are looking for local organizations, preferably CEEs, we can contract with to provide the renewal assistance. Contact Michelle if you think your organization may be interested in participating.

The first open enrollment ended in 2/15. On the 15<sup>th</sup>, Susana was really busy. Then, enrollment got extended again for a few days until 2/22. She remained busy while many members of the public waited until the last minute to enroll.

MISP has been busier since April 30<sup>th</sup> because now there are no more open or special enrollments. To date, we have had 7 applications since April 30<sup>th</sup>. Some people have been enrolled and some have not complied with the requirements to submit verifications. So far, all clients have a share of cost and, as a result, the county has not seen a major impact in the budget. Eligibility can begin the 1<sup>st</sup> of the previous month that someone applies for assistance. This current quarter we had about 12 to 15 MISP applicants, which is about what we had total in the last fiscal year, showing how much interest in MISP has increased.

Per CHC, up to today have had only one MISP patient treated through their clinics. Most of MISP applicants have been ER visits that may not have needed follow-up. DSS and NOOR clinic have also referred people to us.

ASN Update: The largest stumbling block this year has been trying to explain tax issues to our clients and educate them. People are filing taxes with the incorrect 1095. This will create more problems next year.

CenCal Update: Teresa Scott said 2014 member demographic data. CenCal members in all plans currently total about 160,000. Santa Barbara County has about 107,000 and SLO has 51,648. Healthy Kids in SB is 798. In SLO ACA population is about almost with different A codes over 12,000 back in February. Currently as of May 9 total for SB is 20,249 and for SLO is 13,685 with a Cen-Cal ACA total is 32,934. SLO Medi-Cal total population is 51,648. Do not have medi-medi numbers broken out but can get them if request it.

Behavioral Health Update: BH has been collaborating with DSS to decrease wait times and improve access to mental health services for youth dependents of the court. This collaborative effort has resulted in a 30% decrease in wait time from when DSS makes the referral to when the youth receives a Mental Health Assessment. BH has also been focusing on the procedure for clients whose needs are mild to moderate and do not meet medical necessity for Specialty Mental Health Services. Amanda has been collaborating with the Holman Group to standardize and streamline the referral process both with the Holman Group. Clients are referred to the Holman Group after participating in Mental Health Assessments. Clients who are referred to the Holman Group after being opened to the County for a Mental Health Assessment are kept open for 30 days while Amanda follows up with the Holman Group to ensure clients are offered services and assigned providers.

County Admin Update: Leslie brown shared information about a project that has been going for 1yr and a couple of months. There is a DSS enrollment staff person working in the jail to enroll either for M/C or Covered CA. He is very good at it. To date 1645 have been approach and about 59% have filled out applications. There is no actual number at the moment that have successfully completed enrollment. If an inmate is hurt or needs medical attention while incarcerated, the County

is responsible for their care during the incarceration. However, if they have enrolled in Medi-Cal, once they get out of jail, they can go to DSS to complete the enrollment process. If they had Medi-Cal before being incarcerated they have to go to DSS to get reactivate. There may also be a potential in the near future, that incarcerated individuals who had Medi-Cal before incarceration, or who apply while in jail, may be able to have Medi-Cal pay for their care, even WHILE in jail. That process is being worked out at the State level now.

#### **4. May Ly presentation**

May discussed about the In-Person Administrative System (IPAS) – a Covered CA website to get many resources to assist Navigators. The website gives assistors lots of tools to help understand qualifying events including moving from one state to another or one county to another. For additional information about special enrollment you can go to I.1 on the website. There is a table that will give you further detail of life events that qualify. This can be used by you, or given to the public.

Certified Enrollment Counselor webinars are posted on the website as well (section K). You can view past ones and will be able register for the next webinar. There is a program that you need to install to be able to attend to these webinars. There is a list of all webinars that are also in pdf format to review. You have the option to select those of your interest.

Community partners letters are also posted on IPAS. There are a lot of resources, information and phone numbers that you can provide to the public. There is a form for a client called “Your application information” that you can provide when you assist someone.

There is a phone number specifically for CECs or entities, not for consumers. Under the O section of the IPAS website, you can find all the resources that you can print and provide to the consumer.

If you still have clients inquiring about 1095a, information is still in the resources tool kit.

Finally, the site has a social media tool kit with lots of graphics and ideas for posting info about Covered CA on social media.

If you have any question you can contact May Ly and she will assist you.

There will be updated information sent out by the end of June for entities. It will tell you how you can remain active as a CEE for the next open enrollment period. We may lose few entities to assist people to re-enroll since there will be no compensation. Some entities will remain though, with grant funding. October 15 through December 7 is the next open enrollment period.
