### Varicella-Zoster Virus (VZV ) antibody

Test 5100

The DiaSorin ETI-VZV IgG assay is intended for the qualitative and semi-quantitative detection of IgG antibodies to Varicella-Zoster Virus (VZV) in human serum by indirect enzyme immunoassay to determine a prior infection by VZV and, when evaluating paired sera, to aid in the determination of acute or convalescent stage of VZV infection.

Varicella (chicken pox) and zoster (shingles) represent different clinical manifestations of infection with the same agent, Varicella-Zoster virus (VZV), a member of the *Herpesviridae*. Varicella infections occurs most frequently in children, called “Chicken Pox), and is characterized by a generalized vesicular exanthema often accompanied by fever. Zoster or “Shingles” usually occurs in adults or immunocompromised patients and consists of a painful, circumscribed eruption of vesicular lesions with accompanying inflammation of associated dorsal root or cranial nerve sensory ganglia.

The VZV IgG test is intended for the semi-quantitative and qualitative detection of antibodies to VZV antigen.

#### Sample:

- Whole blood without anticoagulant. Separate serum as soon as possible and refrigerated (2 to 8° Celsius). If testing is not completed within 48 hours, or the serum is to be stored beyond 48 hours, samples are to be **frozen at -20° C**.
- Grossly contaminated, hemolyzed, lipemic, or icteric specimens should not be used.
