Hello Ryan,

The Mesa Refinery Watch Group is submitting the following information for inclusion in the materials to be reviewed by the Planning Commissioners regarding sourcing and transporting crude oil to the SMR.

The Monterey County Resource Management Agency letter of January 28, 2016 to the County Planning Commission (attached) states:

“The FEIR included an additional transportation alternative via pipeline (Section 5.1.2)... [for a] pipeline from the rail facility in Bakersfield to Sisquoc Pump Station ... Monterey County approved a pipeline in 2008 for Chevron to pipe oil from the San Ardo field across the Gabilan Mountain Range to Coalinga, a distance of 57 miles, which leads us to believe a local pipeline is feasible and should not have been dropped from further consideration . If project approval is considered, we ask for this alternative to be considered and analyzed as the preferred project .”

The project referenced in the letter is the “Chevron San Ardo to Coalinga Heated Pipeline Project”. The Lead Agency on the project was Monterey County , and the Responsible Agency was Fresno County.

It is suggested that the Monterey County Resource Management Agency be invited to send a representative to brief the Planning Commission on San Ardo -Coalinga pipeline project. Their experience may help inform the Commission on the feasibility of similar pipeline connector as an alternative to the Rail Spur project .

Section 5.1.2.3, page 5-10 of the Rail Project FEIR states: “it is speculative if [Phillips 66] could obtain the right-of-way to construct such a pipeline.” In contrast, the National Pipeline

Mapping System (NPMS) shows that a right-of-way and pipeline alignment already exists for a hazardous liquid pipeline over much of the Kern -Sisquoc route. This alignment (Plains All American Pipeline Line 903 east of Sisquoc) runs through San Luis Obispo County , Santa Barbara County, and Kern County. (See attached NPMS screenshot.)
