I join thousands of other people and agencies throughout California in strongly opposing the Phillips 66 project. It is shocking that the Planning Commission is still moving forward with approval of this project, in any form, over the recommendation of its own

staff and the testimony of hundreds of people, many of them experts, about the devastating consequences of these dangerous trains.

As you know, ANOTHER train -- Union Pacific -- hauling 96 cars of crude oil -- derailed and exploded near the Columbia River in Washington on June 3rd.
