I am asking you and the County Department of Planning and Building to reject the proposal for the Phillips 66 Rail Spur Project on the Nipomo Mesa. I live on the Mesa and my husband and I chose this area because of the bucolic surroundings and the serenity we got when hiking the hills and beaches from Oso Flaco to Ontario Ridge.

I lived in Manhattan Beach, CA for 42 years - another very desirable place to live; however, the city right next door is El Segundo which is home to Standard Oil. I know first hand the noise, the smell, the lights, the constant hum, the 50 foot high flames burning off whatever, the booms in the middle of the night and we didn't have to contend with mile long trains. I remember there once was a fire in one of the reservoirs that lasted three days.

Refineries should be build next to where the oil is drilled and not shipped to the beautiful California coastline.

No, this is not the place for the Rail Spur Extension Project.
