Dear Sir,

I have recently read through the EIR for the proposed P66 Rail Terminal Project. I would like to voice my concern and objection to the project.

Although I do not live in San Luis Obispo County, it is my understanding that the rail route to transport crude oil will run through northern California, and along the track that transverses the City of San Leandro in the East Bay where I live.

I am concerned as a member of the San Leandro City Council, although I am speaking as an individual. The track runs near three of our schools, and several more are in the "blast zone". In addition, many school children have to cross those tracks twice daily. The wait for a 1½ -mile long train will be considerable, and of course, there is no supervision to care for children during the long waits. Finally, it is not defensible or responsible for you to force the School District and City Council to prepare an emergency plan to deal with such a crisis as would occur with an accident or explosion involving such a train.

Finally, my personal concern is that your issuing a permit to allow a facility to handle such toxic material endangers my own family. My daughter, son-in-law, and two small grandchildren

live in San Luis County. They are already in danger from the nuclear plant. It is unconscionable to expose the people of SLO County to future toxics that will occur in the processing and transport of crude oil in that area. I urge you to reject the license for this whole program.
