Dear Mr. Murry;

After carefully reviewing the REIR for the p66 project, I have numerous concerns about the impact on our county, and especially on the Nipomo Mesa area. The entire project is incompatible with SLO County's zoning for our nearby residential community. While the p66 project has been a pipeline delivery, the community and refinery have worked well together.

A rail terminal is an entirely different story. Bright lights, noise pollution, visual interference, air pollution, and the risks associated with crude oil transport do not belong alongside a residential community that has enjoyed panoramic vistas and a serene environment of ocean and agriculture.

The REIR discusses Class one impacts that cannot be mitigated in most these areas. Most significant are the impacts on already poor air quality which cannot be mitigated.
