I am writing to add my firm's support for the Phillips 66 Santa Maria Refinery Rail Project. We provide analytical support for the refinery and have been doing so for many years.

As the discussion over the EIR unfolds, there is risk of it becoming a debate over oil refining in general. Local businesses like mine are counting on decision makers to review the EIR on face value and see what we see. Issues associated with the rail project can be addressed by project conditions.
