I am deeply opposed to the Philips 66 proposal to begin receiving trains of
extreme oil to their refinery in San Luis Obispo.

Our railway system was not designed to transport dangerous, and highly explosive
oil through cities. This move would put many communities in jeopardy, such as
Antioch, Pittsburg, Bay Point, Martinez, Crockett, Rodeo, San Pablo, Richmond, El
Cerrito, Albany, Berkeley, Emeryville, Oakland, San Leandro, Hayward, Union City,
Fremont, and thousands more at risk for accidents and spills, threatening our
air, water, and health, and contributing to climate disruption.

All that one needs to do is to look at Lac Mégantic, in Quebec, to see the
devastating effects that only one accident along this proposed system could
cause. Far too many people live in California to take these types of risks with
the stability of their environment, their businesses, their lives, and their
homes.

The acknowledged "significant air pollution" of this proposed Oil Railway will
