We live on parkhill rd and close to 58. We are very upset about the possibility of a quarry being established here . The county has not been able to repair the roads with proper material due to the economy and cut backs and funds . They are not able to even fix pots holes that last more then 3 weeks,and that's with normal traffic .How are they going to keep up with the up keep of the roads with the damage that huge trucks do,that this quarry will bring.

The cut backs has forced the school buses here to have the younger children ride with the high schoolers and that has made the trips much longer for the students. They will run into these trucks and will have to stop ,wait , or be forced to be even slower to get the students to school . The school is on the way to hyway 58,and they have to pass the proposed site twice a day.

This will put a huge burden on the schools here.

This area out here is not a large rural , there are houses every 5 acres or more . The Santa margarita ranch plans on having homes in the future with even more traffic ,add the trucks running daily and you have a huge traffic problem . These roads are curvy ,winding at places where there are few passing lanes ,very few places to pull off to the side ,they are narrow in spots not capable at all of withstanding heavy trucks . The sides of the roads in spots of 58,parkhill and surrounding areas are already falling apart.

Your talking about blasting, noise, fire risk, drought conditions,destroying small road ways,no pull over places, and with 2 other quarry's serving this small county why would you even consider allowing another one in a area that cant handle this type ,of trucking operation .
