Subject: Scoping Comments for Quarry @ Parkhill Road

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Dear Mr. Oliveira-

We would like your impending EIR for the above referenced Project to address the following items-

- 1) Why are 1.5:1 slopes being allowed for remediation of the site when the Planning Department requires a minimum of 2:1?
- 2) How will the blasting in such close proximity to the State Water Project pipeline affect the cement lined steel pipe? Will the Department in charge of operations for this pipeline be notified and perform their own analysis?
- 3) CalTrans has proposed sightline modifications to Estrada Ave./Hwy 58 just east of the crosswalk at H Street but no work has been done. It is just a matter of time before someone is killed at that intersection during the school year due to ever increasing traffic on this road. Would it not be a good idea to consider realigning Hwy 58 North of the School in order to avoid the children crossing the Hwy and also remove two very sharp turns in the existing roadway?
- 4) Dust control is an ongoing necessity of mining especially in such close proximity to homes. Has the applicant estimated how much water will be required to mitigate dust created by the crushing and stacking operations. This commonly necessitates continual spraying of all the dust generating facilities in addition to constantly watering the roads within the site. Any idea how much water that will require?
