Regarding the Hwy 58 Quarry

As a residence of Park Hill Road, for the past 15 years, I can see nothing but bad resulting from the approval of the Hwy 58 Quarry. We give up many things to live out here in the country like:

* The fact that we don't have much water (my Dad has to bring water in from his house quite often).

* Driving on a winding road every day enduring all of the bicyclist (who rarely ride single, file risking all of our lives), motorcycles, car clubs, people out on a Sunday drive to see the wild flowers, etc. These people don't realize that if you go over the yellow line just for a second you could end your life and the lives of the people you hit.
