Proposed Negative Declarations

A Negative Declaration is issued for projects that would not result in significant effects on the environment. In many cases, the project applicant has added mitigation measures to the project to reduce environmental impacts in order to qualify for a Negative Declaration. If you disagree with the issuance of a proposed Negative Declaration, you may provide comments or file a Request for Review (appeal) of the Negative Declaration. Requests for Review must be filed within two weeks of the date that the proposed Negative Declaration is posted and must address only environmental issues. There is a fee for the request. Draft Supplemental Environmental Impact Report – Mid-Higuera Bypass Project; Project #455R277627; ED 15-151. The Draft Supplemental Environmental Impact Report (DSEIR) for the Mid-Higuera Bypass Project (project) is complete and available for public review and comment. The DSEIR addresses the environmental impacts that may be associated with the request to construct the flood control project.

The proposed project is located within and adjacent to San Luis Obispo Creek between Marsh Street and Madonna Road in the City of San Luis Obispo.

Copies of the DSEIR are available at the City/ County Library of San Luis Obispo. The DSEIR is available on the San Luis Obispo County Flood Control and Water Conservation District web site at: www.slocountywater.org under "News and Information".

The DSEIR focuses on the following issues: biological resources, cultural resources, air quality, visual resources, hazardous materials, drainage/erosion and sedimentation, and noise, The DSEIR also considers two alternatives in addition to the "No Project" alternative.

Per PRC 21092.6 and Government Code Section 65962.5, the subject property is in close proximity to sites on a list (Cortese List) maintained by CalEPA,

These lists generally recognize sites containing a hazardous spill or condition requiring remedial work.
