I. Welcome and Introductions

The meeting was called to order at 3:06 pm.

II. Approval of Minutes

There was a motion made by Star Graber and seconded by Geoff O'Quest to approve the minutes from Sept 15th. All in favor, motion carried.

III. Public Comment

Iain Fenwick wanted to remind the group that the Californians for Safety and Justice Group would be interested in facilitating any data projects with Cal Poly if that is of interest to us. He will forward specific information to Robert Reyes.

IV. Planning/Training

The fourth annual realignment conference is set for Thursday, January 22nd and Friday, January 23rd, 2015. Please contact Virginia to register for the conference. Your travel is reimbursable through the county. The deadline for registration is January 9th. You will be responsible for hotel reservations. There is a special room rate set up at the Hyatt Regency on L Street in Sacramento.

The annual BSCC survey is due again. Probation will fill it out and present their answers to the CCP general membership before sending in. It is due by December 15th.

V. Treasurer's Report

Wendy reported we are at the end of the first quarter and have just over 20% expended from what has been allocated to the various programs so we are on track. We have received just under \$400,000 from the state so we are right on track with receipts as well.

VII. Board of Supervisors AB 109 Presentation

Robert Reyes presented an overview of the AB109 update that will be presented to the Board of Supervisors on October 21st. There will be three videos included this year which help to tell a story of what the CCP has accomplished over the last three years. He wanted to personally thank Michelle Cole, Kelly Kenitz, Geoff O'Quest and Amy Gilman for their assistance.

VIII. Community Recidivism Reduction Grants

Robert Reyes reported that an adhoc committee was asked to come up with some proposals for the \$50,000 Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC) Grant. It will be broken down into five \$10,000 grants for agencies to provide treatment. The committee recommended focusing on those areas that are a gap in service. Some ideas included leisure and pro-social activities, positive peer type mentoring programs, employment/education services, family programs that focus on preventing domestic violence/counseling/education, life skills training connected to what they have already learned in the jail, and cognitive restructuring. The Requests for Proposal would solicit providers of services that are based on the criminogenic needs (issues, activities or situations that can produce or lead to crime or criminality) that have shown to be the highest in this population. Providers would be asked

to describe what they would do to address those needs, and state the number of clients they could provide services for. The RFPs will be posted on the probation website and sent out to vendors in the community. A selection committee will be chosen to review the completed proposals.

Jim reminded the group to submit their BARS to the Treasurer by next Monday (October 27th). The BARS will be presented at the general meeting on November 17th. A CCP Executive Committee meeting will be scheduled for November 18th.
