Announcements from the Chair

I would like to welcome each of you back to our meetings of the Technical Advisory Committee after a long and well deserved break.

The information and leadership provided by the County Project team along with the public Pro/Con analysis that we conducted, both informed the community and went a long way to allay their fears on the Waste Water Project. The overwhelming support to proceed, as indicated by the results of the 218 ballot, was very satisfying to me and I'm sure to the rest of the TAC also.

We are now entering into the second phase of the process and, at today's meeting, we will get a better understanding of the role that we will be playing in that process.

Feedback that I have received from the community indicates that our televised meetings were watched and appreciated by many people. Therefore, whatever our role is, we need to continue to hold our meetings at the South Bay Community Center and televise them live.

I believe that one of our main tasks, as we move forward, will be to comment and provide input to the Project Team, disseminate information on the progress of the design of the sewer, and receive input back from the community on the project.

Under item 2 of today's agenda we will decide on our regular monthly meeting date.

We will also need to look at our by-laws and recommend necessary changes to the Board of Supervisors but that can be for our next meeting.

I would like to remind everyone of the EIR Scoping meeting to be held at the Community Center on Tuesday, December 18, at 7PM. I will need to know who from the TAC will be attending so, if we constitute a quorum, we can announce an adjourned meeting.

There is an open seat on the TAC Financial Committee. The County will shortly be advertising for volunteers for that position.
