AOT is court-ordered, outpatient mental health treatment for individuals with serious mental illness who are unable to be safe in the community without treatment.

Laura's Law went into effect in SLO County in March 2016. This law allows County Behavioral Health to petition a civil court judge to order an adult into AOT when the referred adult needs this level of treatment to be safe in the community.

**For clients meeting court requirements** AOT staff will make numerous outreach attempts to engage and support them in accessing voluntary services. AOT is a field-based, "whatever it takes" approach available throughout SLO County.



### What does AOT help with?

- Services are first offered voluntarily if the person is willing to accept help
- AOT provides oversight by a Judge when needed to encourage compliance
- AOT <u>cannot</u> force medication

AOT outreach and treatment services are provided by a Full Service Partnership (FSP) team. The services offered to court-ordered AOT clients include:

- Intensive case management
- Co-occuring treatment to address both mental health and substance use disorder needs
- Rehabilitation services
- Medication evaluation and support services

#### Who can Request AOT?



- Immediate adult family member
- Adults residing with individual
- Director of treating agency, organization, facility, or hospital providing MH services.
- Treating licensed mental health
  professional
- Peace officer, parole or probation officer supervising the individual.

## Who Qualifies for AOT?



- San Luis Obispo resident, minimum of 18 years of age
- Suffering from a serious mental illness
- Person's condition is at risk of substantially deteriorating
- Person has a history of refusing county mental health or partnering agency treatment
- Person is unlikely to survive in the community without treatment.
- Person has 2 or more hospitalizations in the last 36 months, and/or incarcerations due to untreated mental health resulting in serious violent behavior, threats or attempts of physical harm in the last 48 months
- Person is likely to benefit from AOT.
