COVID-19 Status in SLO County as of 10/27/21

Dr. Borenstein reported that the County has been experiencing a plateau of new COVID-19 cases. 625 people were diagnosed with COVID-19 over the past two weeks. SLO County has seen a 50% decrease in the number of hospitalizations since past month. Currently, 12 people are hospitalized, 4 of which are in the ICU. Increases in the County's COVID-19 related deaths has been ongoing since the September 22nd report. To date, 339 people have died due to COVID-19 and at least 7 deaths are pending final certification.

Community Transmission – SLO County

The following 7-day metrics are from the week of October 20th - October 26th. San Luis Obispo County has met the State's metrics to move from the High (Red) Tier into the Substantial (Orange) Tier. The current COVID-19 case rate among SLO County residents is 62.17 per 100,000. San Luis Obispo County's requirements for the masking mandate still applies. Please view the <u>Health Officer Order</u> requiring Facial Coverings for more information.

SLO County Outbreak Data

There has been a reduction of COVID-19 viral outbreaks occurring within SLO County. Outbreaks remain most prevalent in youth and congregate settings. SLO County currently has active cases in 33 K-12 Schools, 5 outbreaks in Preschool/Childcare locations and 9 outbreaks in congregate settings.

SLO County Vaccine Status of COVID-19 Cases

Unvaccinated individuals are disproportionately impacted by COVID-19. Since June 15, 2021, SLO County residents who are not fully vaccinated encompass at least 78.1% of COVID-19 cases, 83.7% of hospitalizations, and 76.0% deaths.

In <u>SLO County</u>, <u>72.6%</u> of the 12+ population have received at least one dose. By comparison, <u>80.3% of</u> <u>Californians</u> aged 12+ have received at least one dose.

Vaccination Rates by Race/Ethnicity in SLO County

Although Latino residents constitute 24.3% of the County population, the COVID-19 case rate for this group is 533 per 100,000. Conversely, White residents encompass over 2/3 (67.3%) of the County population and have a COVID-19 case rate of 317 per 100,000. These findings suggest SLO County Latino residents are disproportionately impacted by COVID-19.

Neighborhood Level Outreach

On July 26th, 2021, SLO County Public Health Department launched an outreach campaign to provide COVID-19 vaccine services and educational awareness in prioritized neighborhoods. Volunteers have walked over 408 miles, contacted over 7,363 households, and distributed over 19,738 materials. 154 mobile vaccine clinic events have been held.

Vaccine Communication Plans

Tara Kennon, Public Information Officer, discussed communication strategies for the County's COVID-19 response. Several strategies were implemented during the April-October period. Mass communication campaigns were used to promote information county-wide. Vaccine champion activities and relationship-based outreach fostered beneficial relations with residents. Vaccine misinformation, COVID-19 vaccine polarization, and structural barriers continue to inhibit goals for increasing vaccinations in SLO County.

These strategies have been modified for anticipated reception by the public. Mass communications will continue broad messaging with tone focused on positive associations. Audience-specific campaigns will be tailored based on national research and Vaccine Planning team insight. Priority audiences includes pregnant/recently pregnant people, uninsured/limited care persons, older adults (65+) for booster or first/second doses, parents of age 5-11, rural and agricultural communities.

Pediatric Vaccine Doses Administered by Provider

Pediatric doses administered for the 12-18 age group within SLO County:

Pharmacies (48.4%) Public Health Clinics (47.6%) Medical practice offices (3.2%) CHC (0.6%) Other - Home Health, Long Term Care, Hospital (0.2%)

Healthcare Provider Updates

<u>CHC</u> - Dr. Clarke was unable for comment. Provider updates will be given at the December 8th meeting.

<u>CenCal Health</u> - has developed a vaccine response plan to support vaccine uptake in SLO and Santa Barbara Counties. Their primary strategy is increasing amount of healthcare providers who will administer vaccine. Strategies include outreach partnership and incentives for vaccine administrators. Vaccine recipients will receive a \$50 incentive for first dose received. CenCal is actively promoting mobile vaccination clinics for SLO County. CenCal provided the following information which will be shared as an attachment to the meeting minutes:

 - Available to PCP's FQHC's and non-FQHC's
 - PCP will receive \$50.00 per member who receives their first dose of the COVID-19 vaccine. The max a provider can earn per member is \$50.00.
 - Limited to vaccines rendered between October 2021 and March 2022.

Long term care and hospital facilities Karen Jones was unavailable for comment.

<u>Public Health and Private Medical Offices:</u> Pharmacies and Public Health Clinics encompass the majority of administered pediatric doses. Private medical offices are encouraged to increase pediatric vaccine uptake.

Boosters for Moderna and J&J

FDA, CDC, and Western States Scientific Safety Review Workgroup have approved boosters for all vaccine brands, including Moderna and Johnson & Johnson. See below for booster doses eligibility. Public Health and mobile vaccine clinics now offer boosters based on *all* eligibility guidelines.

Heterologous (Mix and Match) doses refer to getting a different COVID-19 booster than the primary dose series. All COVID-19 vaccine boosters result in robust protection from COVID-19 infection. Individuals eligible for the booster may receive the same or different COVID019 vaccine as a booster dose, depending on convenience, availability, health care provider opinion, and individual preference.

Booster Eligibility

Use this chart to help determine when to give COVID-19 vaccine based on age or health conditions: <u>COVID-19 Vaccine Eligibility (eziz.org)</u>

<u> Moderna + Pfizer:</u>

- Eligible 6 months or more after receiving their 2-dose series:
- 65 years and older
- Age 18+ living in long-term care settings
- Age 18+ have underlying medical conditions
- Age 18+ work or reside in high-risk settings
- Age 18+ who are at an increased risk of social inequities

<u>]&] vaccine (age 18+):</u>

• Eligible 2 months or more after receiving the initial dose

Pediatric Vaccines for Age 5-11

On October 26th the FDA Advisory Committee discussed vaccine eligibility for 5-11 yr. olds. Currently awaiting approval from several advisory boards, such as the CDC and Western States Scientific Safety Review Workgroup. Estimated date for Pfizer vaccine age 5-11 eligibility is early November 2021.
