

Pause on Janssen Vaccine

- SLO County pausing J&J due to blood clot concerns, per CDC and FDA recommendations
- 6 of 6.8M doses is rare event
- 6 cases in women ages 18-48, one fatal; occurred 6-13 days after dose
- Unusual type of clot in brain, lungs or abdomen; symptoms shortness of breath, severe headache, abdominal pain; thrombocytopenia (low platelet count)
- 180M doses of Moderna and Pfizer without any major adverse outcomes
- Need targeted and multilingual messaging of reassurance especially to groups overrepresented among J&J recipients (e.g., homeless, homebound, Latinx)


Vaccination Rates


Vaccination Rates by Age






Profile of Undecideds

Likelihood To Get Covid-19 Vaccine When Eligible

Undecideds Will be Easier to Motivate Than Rejectors

One-quarter (25%) of all adults haven't made up their mind about vaccination with more among the African Americans (39%) and Spanish-dominant (36%) populations.

Base: Total 1,451, Asian/PI 264, Black/AA 238, Latinx English/bilingual 322, Spanish-dominant 280



Likelihood To Get Covid-19 Vaccine When Eligible

Undecideds in are Found in All Populations

Age 18-34 (33%), parents (32%), essential workers (34%), and people working outside the home (32%) provide the largest opportunities for the campaign to shift Undecideds to Supporters.



Q26. When you become eligible, how likely are you to get a COVID-19 vaccine?

What Can We Do?

Building Vaccine Confidence

Building vaccine confidence requires acknowledging and addressing concerns;

- Aligning vaccination benefits with emotions, specific values, and priorities;
- Establishing vaccination as a social norm with compelling messages and the support of influencers and trusted sources to increase credibility of information.


