

EHS Well Permit Processing

- Verify Application Information; Refer Applications to Outside Agencies; Draft a Determination of Ministerial Processing Document.
- Survey and inspect potential well sites.
 - Inspect locations for sources of contamination
 - Confirm site is as it is represented on Plot Plan

Pipe in the ground people – not the water use people

- Assure that wells are sealed appropriately to prevent ground water contamination.
- Review the water quality testing and WCRs.



Executive Order N-7-22

- Signed March 28, 2022
- Drought
- Well Permitting Criteria
 Effective Immediately
 - ✓ Will be in effect until the Order is Lifted

- 9. To protect health, safety, and the environment during this drought emergency, a county, city, or other public agency shall not:
 - a. Approve a permit for a new groundwater well or for alteration of an existing well in a basin subject to the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act and classified as medium- or high-priority without first obtaining written verification from a Groundwater Sustainability Agency managing the basin or area of the basin where the well is proposed to be located that groundwater extraction by the proposed well would not be inconsistent with any sustainable groundwater management program established in any applicable Groundwater Sustainability Plan adopted by that Groundwater Sustainability Agency and would not decrease the likelihood of achieving a sustainability goal for the basin covered by such a plan; or
 - b. Issue a permit for a new groundwater well or for alteration of an existing well without first determining that extraction of groundwater from the proposed well is (1) not likely to interfere with the production and functioning of existing nearby wells, and (2) not likely to cause subsidence that would adversely impact or damage nearby infrastructure.

This paragraph shall not apply to permits for wells that will provide less than two acre-feet per year of groundwater for individual domestic users, or that will exclusively provide groundwater to public water supply systems as defined in section 116275 of the Health and Safety Code.




Sustainable Groundwater Management Act SGMA

CA Department of Water Resources Website:

SGMA was passed in 2014 and requires local agencies to form groundwater sustainability agencies (GSAs) for the high and medium priority basins. GSAs develop and implement groundwater sustainability plans (GSPs) to avoid undesirable results and mitigate overdraft within 20 years.

Processing During Order – 9a Non-Exempt Wells

New (or alteration of an existing) wells **in a basin** subject to SGMA and **classified as medium- or high-priority**: GSA will need to declare that the groundwater extraction by the proposed well would not be inconsistent with their sustainable groundwater management program as established by the GSP

EHS Will Refer Applications to the GSAs



Processing During Order – 9b Non-Exempt Wells

New (or alteration of an existing) non-exempt wells must be accompanied by a report signed by a California licensed Professional Geologist with a Certified Hydrogeologist specialty certification that concludes both that extraction of groundwater from the well (1) "is not likely to interfere with the production and functioning of existing nearby wells" and (2) "is not likely to cause subsidence that would adversely impact or damage nearby infrastructure."

"I & S Report"

A single Geo Report that speaks to Deep Well compliance with Standard 13 issues and I&S concerns is ok






Ag or Irrigation Well?

Well Program (Construction, Destruction, and Maintenance)

The purpose of this program is to regulate and permit the construction and installation of community water supply wells, individual domestic wells, industrial wells, agricultural wells, cathodic protection wells, electrical grounding wells, test and exploratory holes, observation wells and salt water (hydraulic) barrier wells.

On March 28, 2022, Governor Gavin Newsom signed Executive Order N-7-22 ("Executive Order") in response to extreme and expanding drought conditions which effective immediately and until lifted prohibits San Luis Obispo County Environmental Health Services ("EHS") from issuing a construction permit for a new groundwater well or for alteration of an existing groundwater well pursuant to Chapter 8.40 of the San Luis Obispo County Code unless certain requirements are met or the permit falls within the limited exception to the requirements.


Private Well Owner Resources

The water quality from private (non-commercial) wells is not regulated or monitored by any outside agency or company. It is the responsibility of the private well owner to ensure that their well water is safe.
