- **The deadline for you to return your official ballot is 8:00pm, Tuesday, June 7, 2022.** You can:
 - Return your ballot by mail. Be sure it is postmarked on or before Election Day. No postage necessary.
 - Return your ballot in person to the Clerk-Recorder's offices, or to any **VBM Ballot Drop Box** located in the County listed in the Voting Instructions.
 - Return your ballot or vote in person at a **Polling Place**, also listed in your Voting Instructions.

Two U.S. Senate Contests on Ballot

The office of U.S. Senate will have **TWO** separate contests on the June 7, 2022, Primary Election ballot. You may vote on both. The first contest is the regular election for the full 6-year term of office beginning on January 3, 2023 (full term). The second contest is a special vacancy election, since the current officeholder is temporarily filing a vacancy, for the remainder of the term ending on January 3, 2023 (partial/unexpired term).

Redistricting and Voting

To get an updated count of the country's population, the U.S. Constitution requires a federal census every ten years. California uses that census data to redraw the Congressional, State Senate, State Assembly, and State Board of Equalization districts based on population changes. The independent California Citizens Redistricting Commission (CCRC) uses the new census data to redraw the Congressional, State Senate, State Assembly, and State Board of Equalization district boundaries. The boundaries for local districts, such as county supervisorial or city council districts, are drawn by those governing bodies and not by the CCRC.

How Your Vote is Counted

Polling places close at 8:00 pm on Election Night, but it can take a few hours for all locations to report results, and weeks before the final totals are known. Ever wondered why? Here's a quick look at what happens to your ballot after you cast it.

Election Night

- The first results are posted shortly after 8:00 pm - these are the Vote by Mail ballots that were returned and processed prior to Election Day.
- After that, we must wait for the first of the polling places across the county to complete their paperwork, pack up their supplies, and return the ballots - this can take more than an hour.
- As polling places report in, their results are tabulated and compiled into countywide results.
- The posted results are updated periodically throughout the night.
- When all polling places have reported, the election night counting is done; however, there are still more ballots to count and a lot more work to do before the results become official (see below).

Ballots counted after Election Day

- **"Last Minute" Vote by Mail Ballots:** Vote by Mail ballots that arrive on Election Day either by mail, returned at a polling place or deposited in a Ballot Drop Box, are processed, and counted in the days after Election Day.
- **Postmarked Vote by Mail Ballots:** Under California law, ballots may be processed even if they arrive after Election Day, as long as they are received by mail no later than 7 days after the election and are postmarked on or before Election Day.
- **Missing or Mismatched Signature:** A voter's signature on the returned vote-by-mail identification envelope must compare with the signature(s) in the voter's registration record. If the voter did not sign the ballot envelope, or if the elections official has determined that the signature on the envelope does not compare to the signature(s) of the voter in the voter's record, the Elections Office will, provide the voter with the applicable notice to cure the missing or mismatched signature. This notice must be returned to the Elections Office no later than 2 days prior to the certification of the election.
- **Provisional Ballots:** These are the last ballots counted because they must be researched and verified; it may take a few weeks, but every valid vote will be counted.

ORDINANCE NO. 2022-1

OCEANO COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT

**AN ORDINANCE FOR LEVY OF A SPECIAL TAX ON REAL PROPERTY
LOCATED WITHIN THE DISTRICT TO FUND LOCAL EMERGENCY
MEDICAL AND FIRE PROTECTION SERVICES**

WHEREAS, the Oceano Community Services District (“OCSD”) is a member agency in the Five Cities Fire Authority (“FCFA”) along with the City of Grover Beach and the City of Arroyo Grande. The FCFA has identified the need for additional full-time emergency responders to ensure adequate local emergency medical and fire protection services for the member communities. This is due, in part, to the continued decline of the existing reserve program and increasing costs; and

WHEREAS, numerous studies have concluded that emergency response personnel staffing levels directly affect the level of community emergency medical and fire protection services and that additional full-time emergency responders are necessary to provide for the overall safety of the community; and

WHEREAS, on June 27, 2018, the OCSD Board considered a report entitled “2018 Fire Service Analysis for the Oceano Community Services District” which included eight options that were evaluated for future emergency medical and fire protection services within Oceano. The report recommended that the most viable and cost-efficient choice for the community of Oceano was to continue to provide emergency medical and fire protection services through the Five Cities Fire Authority with funding supplemented by a special tax ballot measure; and

WHEREAS, the OCSD Board approved amendments to the Five Cities Fire Authority Joint Powers Agreement (“JPA”) in order to 1) fund certain priorities identified in the FCFA Strategic Plan; 2) make changes to the funding formula and funding contributions by the member agencies to reflect current staffing levels; and 3) commit OCSD to the undertaking of a special tax ballot measure; and

WHEREAS, according to said amendments to the JPA, if the proposed Ordinance fails to pass and Oceano is unable to fund its share of the funding formula of the FCFA JPA, Oceano will automatically and without further action cease to be a member of the Five Cities Fire Authority on June 30, 2023; and

WHEREAS, in order to provide the best emergency medical and fire protection services to Oceano, to have a fire department staffed and prepared to provide emergency medical and fire protection services 24-hours a day, 7-days a week, and to accomplish both victim rescue and property conservation, additional funding must be sought. Therefore, the Board of Directors has placed a ballot measure before the voters at the June 7, 2022 election for approval of this Ordinance to levy a special tax on real property within the District to fund emergency medical and fire protection services.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE PEOPLE OF THE OCEANO COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT DO ORDAIN as follows:

Section 1. Authority.

This Ordinance is adopted pursuant to section 4 of Article XIII A, section 4 of Article XIII B, and section 2 of Article XIII C of the California Constitution; Article 3.5 (commencing with section 50075) of Chapter 1 of Part 1 of Division 1 of Title 5 of the Government Code; Article 3.7 (commencing with section 53720) of Chapter 4 of Division 2 of Title 5 of the Government Code; Government Code section 53978; and Government Code section 61121(a).

Section 2. Fiscal Impact Statement [Elections Code section 13119].

Rate of tax to be levied: \$180.00 per parcel located in the Oceano Community Services District. The special tax is subject to annual maximum increases in an amount not to exceed two percent (2%) per year.

Amount of money to be raised annually: \$410,760.00 (estimated).

Duration of the tax: The authorization to levy the tax pursuant to this Ordinance shall continue until repealed by the voters.

The tax information estimates in this statement reflect the District's current determination of the number of taxable parcels, which is based on certain assumptions. The actual amount of money raised in each year the tax is levied may vary due to factors including, but not limited to, variations in the number of taxable parcels within the District and inflation.

Section 3. Tax Imposed and Purpose of Tax.

A special tax for the purpose of funding emergency medical and fire protection services shall be imposed on all parcels of real property in the Oceano Community Services District for each fiscal year, commencing with fiscal year 2022-2023. The maximum amount of the special tax for fiscal year 2022-2023 shall be \$180.00 per parcel.

Beginning with fiscal year 2023-2024, and for each fiscal year thereafter, the maximum amount the special tax shall increase is two percent (2%).

The records of the San Luis Obispo Assessor as of March 1st of each year shall be used to identify each parcel for the calculation of the special tax applicable to that parcel in the following fiscal year. For the purposes of this Ordinance, the term "parcel" shall mean a parcel of real property having a separate assessor's parcel number as shown on the last equalized assessment roll of San Luis Obispo County.

Section 4. Exemptions.

A. To the extent required by California and Federal law, the following parcels shall be exempt from the tax imposed by this Ordinance:

1. Parcels owned by Federal or State governmental agencies;
2. Parcels owned by local governmental agencies; and
3. Parcels exempt from taxation by the District pursuant to the laws or constitutions of the United States and/or the State of California.

B. Any person or entity claiming an exemption from the tax imposed by this Ordinance shall file a verified statement of exemption on a form prescribed by the

Oceano Community Services District General Manager prior to June 30th of the first fiscal year for which the exemption is sought.

Section 5. Ballot Question.

Pursuant to the California Elections Code, the abbreviated statement of the proposition, as it appears on the ballot is as follows:

To maintain rapid response times for 911 medical emergency/fire protection services, provide 24-hours a day, 7-days a week staffed medical emergency/fire vehicles, shall Oceano Community Services District Ordinance No. 2022-1 levying an annual special tax of \$180.00 per parcel, providing \$410,760 a year, subject to annual maximum increases capped at 2%, until repealed by voters, and requiring independent citizen oversight and annual reports, be adopted?

Section 6. Use of Tax Proceeds.

The proceeds of the special tax shall be deposited in a special account, created and maintained by the District and will be used solely for the purpose of providing 24-hours a day, 7-days a week staffed emergency medical and fire protection services within the District and for the costs of administering the special tax, including, but not limited to, the costs of collection. Proceeds of this special tax will not be used for any other purpose and will not be used to offset other District obligations.

(a) For purposes of this Ordinance, "emergency medical and fire protection services" include, but are not limited to, fire protection services, rescue services, emergency medical services, hazardous material emergency response services, ambulance services, and other services relating to the protection of lives and property that are critical to the public peace, health, and safety of the District's residents and members of the public.

(b) For the purposes of this Ordinance, the District's costs of "providing 24-hours a day, 7-days a week staffed emergency medical and fire protection services" include, but are not limited to, the following: salaries, benefits, training, and all other personnel related costs; the costs of acquiring or leasing, operating, and maintaining equipment and apparatus used for fire and emergency services; the costs of operating, maintaining, repairing, renovating, and equipping fire facilities.

Section 7. Method of Collection.

The special tax imposed by this ballot measure is due from each owner of record of a parcel within the District as reflected upon the rolls of the County Assessor at the same time the ad valorem tax is due and is to be collected in the same manner. The San Luis Obispo County Tax Collector shall collect the tax and any penalty or interest due hereunder; provided however, that

the District Board of Directors may authorize other appropriate methods of collection of the special tax by appropriate resolution(s). The special tax shall have the same lien priority and be subject to the same penalties and the same procedure and sale in cases of delinquency, as provided for ad valorem taxes.

Section 8. Accountability Measures.

- A. Account. Upon the levy and collection of the tax authorized by this Ordinance, an account shall be created into which the proceeds of the tax will be deposited. The proceeds of the tax authorized by this Ordinance shall be applied only to the specific purposes identified in this Ordinance.
- B. Annual Report. An annual report that complies with the requirements of Government Code section 50075.3 shall be filed with the District Board of Directors no later than January 1st of each fiscal year in which the tax is levied.

Section 9. Citizen Oversight Committee.

The Board of Directors shall establish a Citizen Oversight Committee (the "Committee"). The Committee shall review and evaluate annual expenditures made by the District from the proceeds of the special tax ("special tax proceeds"). The Committee may receive and review copies of the Report prepared pursuant to Section 8 of this Ordinance, and may inspect all facilities and contracts entered into for which special tax proceeds have been or will be expended. The Committee shall consist of a minimum of three (3) members appointed by the District Board of Directors or as otherwise deemed appropriate. To be a qualified candidate for the Committee, a person must be at least 18 years of age and reside within the District's geographic boundaries. The Committee may not include any employee or officer of the District, or any vendor, contractor, or consultant of the District.

Section 10. Severability.

If any section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, or clause of this Ordinance or any part thereof is for any reason held to be unlawful, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion of this Ordinance or any part thereof. The People of the Oceano Community Services District hereby declare that they would have passed each section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, or clause thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, or clause be declared unlawful.

Section 11. Recitals.

That the recitals set forth hereinabove are true, correct, and valid.

Section 12. Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall not become effective unless approved at the June 7, 2022, election by a two-thirds (2/3) majority of the voting registered voters within the District. This Ordinance shall become effective ten (10) days after the vote is certified by San Luis Obispo County.

PASSED AND ADOPTED by the People of the Oceano Community Services District at an election held on June 7, 2022.

IMPARTIAL ANALYSIS OF MEASURE A-22

This measure has been placed on the ballot by the Board of Directors (“the Board”) of the Oceano Community Services District (“OCSD”) and will determine whether an ordinance imposing a special tax on all real property within the OCSD will be approved for the purpose of maintaining rapid response times for 911 medical emergency and fire protection services through the Five Cities Fire Authority (“FCFA”).

Pursuant to a joint powers agreement (“JPA”), the OCSD and the cities of Grover Beach and Arroyo Grande (collectively, “the local agencies”) are members of the FCFA, which provides emergency medical and fire protection services to the local agencies. In 2019, the local agencies amended the JPA to (1) fund certain priorities identified in the FCFA strategic plan; (2) make changes to the funding formula and local agency to reflect current staffing levels; and (3) commit OCSD to undertake approval of a special tax. The amendments to the JPA provide that if the special tax is not approved, OCSD will automatically cease to be a member of the FCFA on June 30, 2023.

The OCSD is authorized by Government Code section 50075 et seq. and section 61121, subdivision (a), to impose special taxes pursuant to the provisions of Article XIII A of the California Constitution. Additionally, Government Code section 53978 specifically authorizes the OCSD to propose by ordinance the adoption of a special tax to provide for fire protection and prevention services. Consistent with California Constitution, Article XIII C, section 2(d), and Government Code section 53722, the tax will become effective only if the ordinance is approved by a 2/3rds vote of qualified voters.

If the measure is approved, commencing with fiscal year 2022-23, a special tax in the amount of \$180 per parcel shall be imposed on each parcel of real property within the OCSD having a separate assessor’s parcel number, as shown on the last equalized assessment roll of San Luis Obispo County. This amount will increase each fiscal year thereafter by no more than 2%. The special tax will be levied annually by the Board and collected by the San Luis Obispo County Tax Collector in the same manner, at the same time, and will be subject to the same penalties, as other property taxes collected.

The measure includes certain accountability requirements, including: (1) a statement indicating the specific purposes of the tax; (2) that the proceeds shall be applied only to fund these specific purposes; (3) the creation of an account to maintain the proceeds; (4) the preparation and filing of an annual report disclosing the amount of funds collected and expended for the stated purposes of the tax; and (5) the creation of a citizens’ oversight committee to review and evaluate annual expenditures made from the tax proceeds.

A “yes” vote on this measure is a vote in favor of imposing a special tax to fund the maintenance of rapid response times for medical emergency and fire protection services within the OCSD.

A “no” vote on this measure is a vote against imposing a special tax to fund the maintenance of rapid response times for emergency medical and fire protection services within the OCSD.

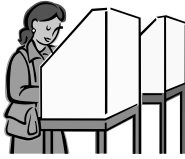

Assistance for Voters with Disabilities



San Luis Obispo County is committed to ensuring every voter can cast their ballot privately and independently. Below is detailed information about assistance that the County offers to voters with disabilities.

- **Vote by Mail:** Your Official Ballot has automatically been sent to you. Return your Official Ballot by mail, drop box, or Polling Place.
- **Vote at a Polling Place:** On Election Day, you may choose up to two people to help you vote at any polling place or County Clerk-Recorder's office. This person cannot be: • your employer or anyone who works for your employer • your labor union leader or anyone who works for your labor union.

Accessible ballot-marking machines (ICX) are available at every polling place on Election Day and at the County Clerk-Recorder's office 29 days prior to the election.

- If you arrive at a polling place and cannot get to the voting area, ask for assistance.
- **Accessible Voter Information Guide on the Web:** Voter Information Guides are available on the County Clerk-Recorder's website with the use of personal accessible navigational tools and screen reader technology.

Remote Accessible Vote by Mail

A new voting experience can be provided by the elections staff for all voters, including those with disabilities by using web-based tools on a personal computer, printer, and one's personal assistive device(s) (screen readers, tactile switches, closed captioning, sip and puff system, etc.) to access and mark one's ballot, then returning it by mail to the Elections Office.

HELPFUL HINTS

MAKE ELECTION DAY EASIER!

Your precinct workers are citizens like you. They sincerely want to make voting easy while protecting your voting rights and ensuring that all election laws are followed. Here are some ideas for you to make Election Day easier for all.

- If you are not planning on voting by mail, check to make sure you know where your polling place is located. If you are not sure how to locate your polling place, go to our polling place look-up on the web (www.slovote.com) or contact us before Election Day, if possible.
- Go to the polls prepared. Read and mark the contests prior to Election Day and take this Voter Information Guide with you to refer to while you are in the voting booth. This is especially helpful with a lengthy ballot and can also help the precinct workers locate your name and address on the voter roster.
- If you are a first time voter, be prepared to show identification, see below.

REQUIREMENTS FOR FIRST TIME VOTERS

The Help America Vote Act requires first time voters to show identification when voting. If you registered to vote by mail after January 1, 2003 and have not previously voted in San Luis Obispo County you will be required to show your current valid photo I.D. or a copy of one of the following that shows your name and address when you go to the polls on election day: Current Utility Bill, Bank Statement, Government Check, Government Paycheck or a Government Document. The same requirement applies if you vote by mail. You will be required to send a copy of one of the above documents with your voted vote-by-mail ballot. If you have questions about your status as a First Time Voter, please contact us.

WARNING: ELECTIONEERING PROHIBITED!

VIOLATIONS CAN LEAD TO FINES AND/OR IMPRISONMENT.

WHERE:

- Within the immediate vicinity of a person in line to cast their ballot or within 100 feet of the entrance of a polling place, curbside voting or drop box the following activities are prohibited.

WHAT ACTIVITIES ARE PROHIBITED:

- *DO NOT* ask a person to vote for or against any candidate or ballot measure.
- *DO NOT* display a candidate's name, image, or logo.
- *DO NOT* block access to or loiter near any ballot drop boxes.
- *DO NOT* provide any material or audible information for or against any candidate or ballot measure near any polling place, vote center, or ballot drop box.
- *DO NOT* circulate any petitions, including for initiatives, referenda, recall, or candidate nominations.
- *DO NOT* distribute, display, or wear any clothing (hats, shirts, signs, buttons, stickers) that include a candidate's name, image, logo, and/or support or oppose any candidate or ballot measure.
- *DO NOT* display information or speak to a voter about the voter's eligibility to vote.

The electioneering prohibitions summarized above are set forth in Article 7 of Chapter 4 of Division 18 of the California Elections Code.

WHY YOUR BALLOT WOULD NOT BE COUNTED

1. Ballot arrives after the deadline.
2. The VBM Return Envelope is not signed.
3. The signature on the VBM Return Envelope does not match the signature on the voter's Affidavit of Registration.
4. The ballot is returned without the I.D. Return Envelope.

VBM Cure Process: The law requires the Election Office to send a letter and verification form to voters who forgot to sign their return envelope or whose signatures did not match their signatures on file. In order for these ballots to be counted, voters must sign and return their form prior to the deadline.
