- California Advancing and Innovating Medi-Cal (CalAIM) is a multi-year initiative by the Department of Health Care Services- each step of CalAIM has a lot of challenges.
- Medi-Cal enrollment is up, and staffing is down. 21% of budgeted LPHA positions are vacant. 23% of Counties have Mental Health vacancies over 30%.

- Improved data exchange- trying to be able to share clinical data to serve our clients better. The goal: have databases and paperwork to be the same by 2027.
- Hiring: How do we enhance our workforce.
