# Push-Dose (PD) EPINEPHRINE 10 mcg/mL (1 mg/100 mL) (Adrenalin)

Classification:	Sympathomimetic agent (catecholamine)
Actions:	<ul> <li>Increases cardiac output due to increased inotropy, chronotropy, dromotropy (β1 effect)</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Relaxes smooth muscles of the respiratory tract (β2 effect)</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Increases systolic blood pressure due to increased cardiac output (β1effect) and vasoconstriction (α effect)</li> </ul>
Indications:	<ol> <li>Symptomatic adult bradycardia refractory to other therapies</li> <li>ROSC with persistent hypotension</li> <li>Distributive shock (septic or neurogenic) unresponsive to fluid resuscitation</li> <li>Cardiogenic shock with signs/symptoms of CHF or not responding to fluid resuscitation</li> </ol>
Contraindications:	There are no absolute contraindications in a life-threatening situation
Precautions:	<ul><li>Hypovolemia: correct volume depletion prior to administration</li><li>Cardiac disease and ischemia</li></ul>
Adverse Effects (select list):	<ul> <li>Frequency not defined:</li> <li>CNS: Excitability, dizziness, drowsiness, disorientation, headache, exacerbation of Parkinson's, paresthesia, cerebral hemorrhage</li> <li>Resp: Dyspnea, pulmonary edema</li> <li>CV: Angina, cardiac ischemia, HTN, vasoconstriction, palpitations, tachyarrhythmia, supraventricular and ventricular dysrhythmias, CVA</li> <li>Metabolic: hyperglycemia, hypoglycemia, hypokalemia, acidosis</li> <li>GI: Nausea and vomiting</li> <li>Other: Tremor, pallor, erythema, diaphoresis, piloerection</li> <li>Tissue necrosis at injection site</li> </ul>
Administration:	Mix 1 mL of epinephrine 1:10,000 (0.1 mg/mL) with 9 mL NS in a 10 mL syringe. Mixture now provides 10 mL of epinephrine at a 10 mcg/mL concentration

# **LABEL SYRINGE** with "Epinephrine 10 mcg/mL"

## **ADULT DOSE**

Base station order only: 1 mL IVP every 1-3 min Repeat as needed. No max

> Titrate timing of repeat doses to maintain SBP >90 mmHg, heart rate, or other indicators of prefusion

## **PEDIATRIC DOSE**

Base station order only: 1 mL IVP (0.1 mL/kg if <10 kg) every 1-3 min Repeat as needed. No max

• Titrate timing of repeat doses maintain age appropriate minimum SBP mmHg, or other indicators of prefusion.

Bradycardia: See epinephrine 1:10,000 formulary

## **Notes:**

- Attempt to correct hypovolemia with IV fluid bolus prior to administration of any vasopressors.
- Anaphylactic shock and pediatric bradycardias with circulatory collapse, refer to Protocols #611 and #644. Base physician may order PD epinephrine at their discretion.
