Outbreaks of any disease (including diseases not listed in §2500). Specify institutional and/or open community.

Occurrence of any unusual disease

**HIV Reporting:** DO NOT FAX REPORTS. HIV infection is reportable by traceable mail or person-to-person transfer within seven (7) calendar days by completion of the HIV/AIDS Case Report Form (CDPH 8641A). For HIV-specific reporting requirements, see Title 17, CCR, §2641.5-2643.2

**Reportable Non-Communicable Diseases/Conditions:** Disorders characterized by lapses of consciousness (§2800-2812),

Alzheimer’s Disease, or other conditions that may impair the ability to operate a motor vehicle safely (H&SC 103900); Pesticide-related illness or injury (known or suspected cases; H&SC 105200); Cancer (H&SC 10387), including benign and borderline brain tumors (except 1) basal and squamous skin cancer unless occurring on genitalia, and 2) carcinoma in-situ and CIN III of the cervix §2593)
