Vaccination Requirements for Expanded Transitional Kindergarten

School districts in California are now required by state law to expand their Transitional Kindergarten (TK) classrooms until all four-year-olds are eligible for TK by 2025-26. A <u>transitional kindergarten</u> is the first year of a two-year kindergarten program. In 2023-24 (pursuant to Education Code section 48000[c]) children are eligible for TK if they turn age five between September 2 and April 2.

As students begin completing school physicals and updating immunizations over the summer months, it is important to note that **children entering TK are required to be** <u>up-to-date on</u> <u>kindergarten vaccinations</u>:

- Diphtheria, Tetanus, and Pertussis (DTaP, DTP, Tdap, or Td);
- Hepatitis B;
- Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR)

• Polio (OPV or IPV)

• Varicella (Chickenpox)

Prior to the expansion of TK, many children did not receive these vaccines until they entered kindergarten at age five. Key reminders:

- <u>California's kindergarten immunization requirements</u> specify that four-year-old children need their kindergarten immunizations prior to the first day of transitional kindergarten, where they could potentially be exposed to vaccine-preventable diseases. The federal Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices, American Academy of Pediatrics, and American Academy Family Physicians recommend kindergarten immunizations starting as young as four years of age. (See <u>CDC's Child and Adolescent Immunization Schedule</u> for more details.) Children need documentation of required immunizations or a valid exemption prior to admission to transitional kindergarten.
- For students who are three years old at the time of admission to TK (<u>Education Code</u> <u>section 48000[c]</u>), schools are recommended to initially apply the <u>pre-kindergarten</u> <u>immunization requirements</u> and to follow up with these students once they turn four years old to apply the TK/K immunization requirements.
- In addition to required vaccines, children are <u>recommended to receive an annual</u> <u>influenza vaccine and stay up-to-date on COVID-19 vaccines</u>.
