

County of San Luis Obispo Public Health Laboratory Select Agent Identification & Exposure Guidelines for Sentinel Laboratories

In the event of a select agent identification and exposure, there are certain protocols that need to be followed. This document will serve as a guideline for your laboratory to follow. This is NOT exhaustive, and changes may need to be made based on the specific circumstances.

- If a Select Agent is identified by the County of San Luis Obispo Public Health Laboratory (SLOPHL) or by the Microbial Diseases Laboratory (MDL), your laboratory will be required to fill out and submit APHIS/CDC Form 4 sections C and D.

 - b. Note: SLOPHL or MDL will initiate APHIS/CDC Form 4 sections A and B.
- 2. If there is a potential exposure at your lab, you must fill out **APHIS/CDC Form 3**.

- 3. If a Select Agent is identified by SLOPHL or MDL and your lab still has specimens, isolates, and derivatives, they must be destroyed within 7 days of identification. Upon request, your lab may need to transfer the specimens, isolates, and derivatives to a reference lab which requires **APHIS/CDC Form 2** section **2** to be filled out by your lab.
