Proposed Negative Declarations

A Negative Declaration is issued for projects that would not result in significant effects on the environment. In many cases, the project applicant has added mitigation measures to the project to reduce environmental impacts in order to qualify for a Negative Declaration. If you disagree with the issuance of a proposed Negative Declaration, you may provide comments or file a Request for Review (appeal) of the Negative Declaration. Requests for Review must be filed within two weeks of the date that the proposed Negative Declaration is posted and must address only environmental issues. There is a fee for the request. SUB2017-00004 / CO17-00059 (ED17-041)

A request by SHELLA & DONALD CARONI for a Tentative Parcel Map (CO 17-0059) to subdivide an existing thirteen-acre parcel into two parcels of six acres and seven acres in size, for the purpose of sale and/or development. The site is currently developed with a primary and a secondary residence, workshop, detached garage and accessory building that would all be located on the proposed seven-acre Parcel 1, leaving Proposed Parcel 2 vacant. A 10-foot Adjustment to the required 80-foot front setback is requested to accommodate existing development on Proposed Parcel 1. The proposed project is within the Residential Rural land use category, and is located at 564 Applegate Way, Arroyo Grande. The site is in the South County Inland sub area of the South County planning area.
