



Affordable Housing Standards

SAN LUIS OBISPO COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF PLANNING AND BUILDING

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This bulletin summarizes the county's affordable housing standards including maximum household incomes, home purchase prices and rents. It applies to new projects in both the Coastal and Inland portions of the County.

Income limits:

The state defines family income groups as follows: **"Extremely Low Income"** is defined by Health and Safety Code Section 50106 as 30% of county median income; **"Very Low Income"** is defined by Health and Safety Code Section 50105 as 50% of county median income; **"Lower Income"** is defined by Health and Safety Code Section 50079.5 as 80% of county median income; **"Moderate Income"** is defined by Health and Safety Code Section 50093 as 120% of county median income; **"Workforce"** is defined by Title 22 of the County Code as 160% of county median income. The following income limits are effective as of April 26, 2021.
