CARES Act - Community Development Block Grant (CDBG-CV3) Program Application

In response to the Coronavirus Pandemic (COVID-19) the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) notified the County of San Luis Obispo Department of Planning and Building on September 118, 2020 that it will receive an entitlement allocation of \$1,876,904 in Community Development Block Grant (CDBG-CV3) funds from the third tranche of CARES Act funds to be used **to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the coronavirus**. The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act) authorized these allocations via, Public Law 116-136, which was signed by President Trump on March 27, 2020, to respond to the growing effects of COVID-19.

Through the CARES Act, HUD issued a mega-waiver for grantees that will enable swift implementation of CDBG-CV grants that allows for a truncated public comment period (5-day comment period as opposed to the standard 30 days). The **CARES Act also eliminated the CDBG 15% cap for public services** to help with the immediate and emergency need to address the COVID-19 virus while retaining the CDBG income eligibility and documentation requirements. Please refer to the HUD income limits for San Luis Obispo County below to help determine client eligibility. \$1,501,524 in CDBG-CV3 funds will be available for award as the County plans to retain the allowed 20% for administrative costs.

Request for Proposals and CDBG-CV3 Application

On November 20, 2020, the County publish the CDBG-CV3 Request for Proposals (RFP) and an abbreviated notice and application period for CDBG-CV3 funding. If your organization anticipates an increase in services directly related to the COVID-19 outbreak, or has a new proposal for directly addressing increased community needs **directly related to the prevention of, preparing for, and responding to COVID-19 outbreak**, under the CARES Act, please submit this Application as instructed below no later than **12:00 P.M.** (Noon), Monday, December 28, 2020. The application must highlight how the need for services has increased directly because of the COVID-19 pandemic, or detail how a new program/activity is meeting the needs created by the current health crisis per the CARES Act.

Please note that decrease in funding/fundraising from other sources are not considered to be eligible reasons for the allocation of CDBG-CV3 funding. Applicants must show a direct increase in service need because of the pandemic. Additionally, applicants must verify that no other state/federal funding are available to meet these needs to <u>avoid funding duplication (Stafford Act)</u> required by the CARES Act. Finally, all proposals must comply with applicable CDBG regulations, CDBG-CV3 and CARES Act regulations, programmatic requirements, and the applicant must have the capacity to undertake and comply with all federal regulations.

Applications MUST address one of the three national objectives set by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), including increased community needs **directly related to the prevention of, preparing for, and responding to COVID-19 outbreak**, under the CARES Act, or they will NOT be considered for CDBG-CV3 funding (see the section on Qualifying Criteria for detailed information on the objectives). Furthermore, completed applications should provide the necessary exhibits, budgets, or requested information on targeted CDBG-eligible populations. Please email grant applications to

actionplan@co.slo.ca.us by the application deadline of **12:00 P.M.** (Noon), Monday, December **28**, **2020**. Please label your email subject with the grant program name and the agency name (Example: CDBG-CV3 – CAPSLO). *Note: Supplemental documents and information or answers which exceed the allotted space or character limit may be added as attachments.

Important Notes:

- The Performance Period for these CDBG-CV3 funds extends to August 30, 2022 at which time all
 funds must be expended and invoices with supporting expenditure documentation, final beneficiary
 documentation and accomplishments narratives shall be submitted for review and approval. The
 County can consider an earlier reimbursement date with proper documentation.
- The County is seeking applicants for eligible activities from non-profit organizations or government entities that have a 1) DUNS number and an active registration in SAM (https://sam.gov/SAM/). Please contact Tony Navarro at tnavarro@co.slo.ca.us or at (805) 781-5787, if your organization does not already have an "Active" status in SAM.gov; 2) are able to provide audited financial statements, and 3) comply with all CDBG-CV3 regulations. Congress established by **Community Development Block Grant** in 1974 with passage of the Housing and Community Development Act and is administered by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). This program provides funds to municipalities and other units of government around the country to develop viable urban communities. This is accomplished by providing affordable, decent housing, a suitable living environment and by expanding economic opportunities principally for low- and moderate-income persons. Although local units of government develop their own programs and funding priorities, all activities must be consistent with one or more of the following HUD national objectives:

- Principally benefits low- and moderate-income persons
- Prevents or eliminates slum or blight
- Addresses an urgent need or problem in the community (e.g., natural disaster)
