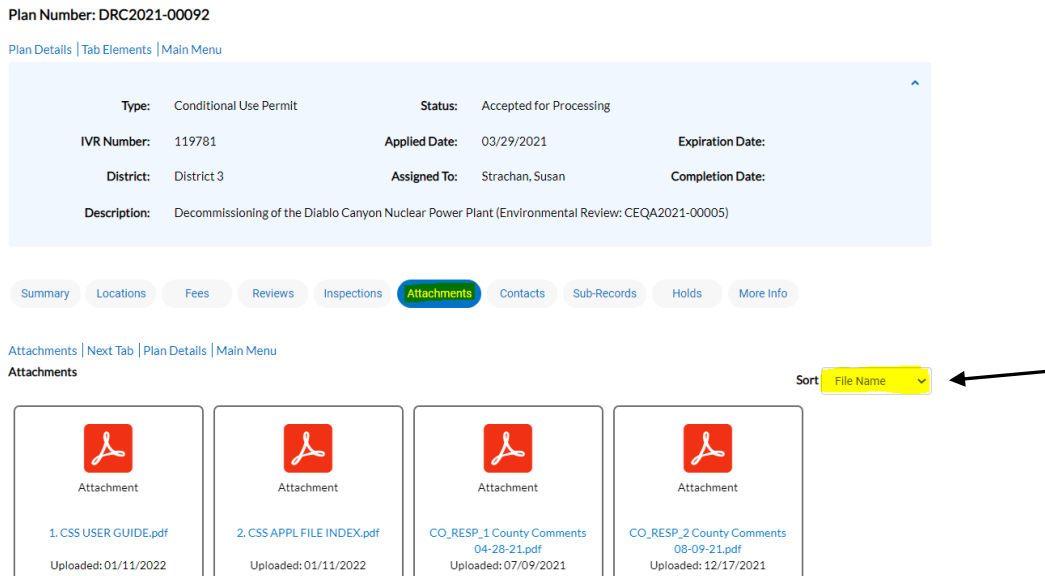


CSS User Guide to Application Files in DRC2021-00092

Documents for the DCP Decommissioning project in CSS have been re-named to facilitate sorting for easy identification. Table 1, Submittal & Response Action Timeline, above, shows filename prefixes (i.e., PGE_SUBM_1, CO_RESP_1, etc.) which denote actions relating to the Applicant’s submittal and the County’s responses by date of action. Table 2, Application File Index, is found in CSS as “**2. CSS APPL FILE INDEX**” and lists the new file name with prefix for each document; the previous file name; an explanation of the document’s contents; and information about the file’s version status.



Diablo files in CSS can now be “sorted” by the new file name prefixes. On the County’s CSS Attachments page for the project (linked here): [DRC2021-00092 \(sloplanning.org\)](https://sloplanning.org/DRC2021-00092), first sort the file pdfs using the down-arrow next to the “Sort” option located to the right of the top row of document tiles (shown above). Select the “File Name” sort option to put the documents into chronological sequence by County and PG&E. Then, open the “**2. CSS APPL FILE INDEX**”, second from the left at the top, to identify files and see how the file names have been modified. Use the Index to identify file content and “PGE_SUBM_1” files that were replaced by “PGE_SUBM_2”. Note that the “Sort” function button also has a “Date” option; this sorts by the date of the file’s upload to CSS, which often is different from the date the file was created or submitted. Files will be added throughout the Environmental Review process as information is provided or modified.
