COMMENTS FROM OTHER AGENCIES

- Probation**–(Jim Salio) The juvenile bi-annual inspection of the Juvenile Hall is underway. The Board of Community Correction does their inspection every two years. This will be the first inspection of Coastal Valley Academy.
- DSS/ CWS**- (Elise Roberts) The Dept of Child Welfare Services is continuing efforts to bring the 37 teens that are out of county placement back to San Luis Obispo County. So far, the nationwide search to find relatives is paying off. In the last month, the number of teens in out of county group homes has dropped down to 33. Elise also reported on CalWORKs 2.0; this is a comprehensive approach to working with families. The goal is to help them find employment by providing other services that can include financial aid.

District Attorney- (James Graff-Radford) Reported on campus safety, and efforts to keep children safe.

d) **SLO County of Education- (Katherine Aaron)** A meeting was held last month by Superintendent James Brescia to address the changing needs of students. Superintendent Brescia brought all the superintendents including several different law enforcement agencies together to address the ongoing issues. The goal is to address the changing needs of students, so no student gets left behind.

The 2018 Building Community Summit is scheduled on May 11 at the Vina Robles Winery. The topic of the meeting will be “how do we unite as a community to help the needs of the students.” A follow up two-day equity summit is scheduled for June. An update will be given at the next DPC meeting.

Law Enforcement- (Tim Olivas) The active shooter program has been rolled out at Templeton, Coast Union and Nipomo High. The goal is to have the active shooter panic button installed in all the schools by the beginning of the next school year. The next step is to put on a presentation to educate and train the staff as well as students on how to prepare in case of an active shooter on campus.

e) **Behavioral Health- (Patty Ford)** Patty reported the Health Agency Director positions are in the process of being filled. It was also stated they are in the process of reclassifying all internal positions under the Behavior Health Dept. Patty reported on the time and distance standards for Behavior Services and Drug and Alcohol Services. They have always had a 14-day timeframe for care and assessment. That has now changed to business 10 days. They have applied for a Youth crisis grant through SB82. This grant will provide youth specific crisis services in the county that will facilitate a youth Service Specialist to respond to the emergency rooms as well as schools when kids are in crisis.

for the pepper spray to be kept in a locked and secure location and be used as a last resort to suppress a fight. The Juvenile Justice Commission is taking an opposing position on bill AB 2010. The Commission will be putting together an opposition letter voicing their concerns for safety of the juveniles and officers.
