The group has not been at capacity yet. CalPoly Cares is a grant that the helps provide funds for unexpected expenses and emergencies one-time. <p>4.1 Discussion Item: Homeless Emergency Assistance Program (HEAP) Grant and Homeless Housing, Assistance, and Prevention Program (HHAPP) Grant Update</p>	<p>Laurel shared with the group that the Homeless Emergency Assistance Program (HEAP) Grant was awarded to our area last year. The Homeless Housing, Assistance, and Prevention Program (HHAPP) Grant was recently applied for by the County as both the County and the Continuum of Care. Laurel explained to the group that the differences between the new grants: HEAP</p>		

<p>4.2 Discussion Item: Marketing/Communications Process and Staffing</p>	<p>was less constricted regarding eligible activities than HHAPP. HHAPP eligibility requirements look for services that come with housing or warming centers. HHAPP eligibility also requires outcome tracking, exits to permanent housing, and the County and Homeless Services Oversight Council (HSOC) working closely together. The group discussed eligibility criteria, current projects and how they fit together. The request for proposal for the HHAPP grant should come out sometime in spring of 2020.</p> <p>Devin informed the group of the importance of marketing and communications of homeless services as well as public education about supporting the community. The group discussed what it might look like to have a contracted marketing expert. The group discussed the importance of being updated on the new state laws around housing. The group discussed how this committee could help support this idea moving forward. Devin will be looking into a marketing company to assist with the marketing plan.</p>		
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<p>4.3 Discussion Item: Amend the HSOC Bylaws section on Election and/or reappointment of members</p>	<p>Laurel shared with the group that in order to amend the membership section there is another part of the bylaws that need to be amended. The County Council is looking into the information and will be getting back to HSOC prior to bring the final recommendations forward.</p>		
<p>4.4 Discussion Item: Homeless Seniors</p>	<p>Laurel informed the group that this discussion item has been brought up by groups. There has been a rise in homeless seniors at a national level as well as locally. The current programs and services don't necessarily support this subpopulation. The shelters are finding that seniors stay longer than other due to the subpopulation having nowhere to go. Janna explained that so far south county/5 cities homeless coalition has seen that 20% of their clients are seniors. The group discussed this community issue. The group discussed what it might look like to open a facility in our area and find an agency to operate it. The group discussed what it would look like to have board and care facility. HUD has a section 202 program that supports seniors. The group discussed a current (HASLO) Housing Authority of San</p>
