# Vaccine Task Force Overview

**Mission:** The Vaccine Task Force is a countywide, multi-sector collaboration addressing the impacts of COVID-19 and working toward community recovery and resilience.

## Task Force Purpose (2022)

- Acts as a trusted messenger to unique audiences, amplifies and clarifies PH messaging





# Omicron, SLO County

- 97% of local specimens sequenced are Omicron
- 3% are Delta
  
- Even though hospitalizations and deaths are high, proportionally less severe disease.







CDPH LHJ Vaccine Progress Dashboard Tableau Data (1.23.22)







# Vaccinate and Unvaccinated Data, CA

## Cases

- Unvaccinated persons were **4.1 times more likely** to contract COVID-19 than fully vaccinated individuals. (January 3, 2022 – January 9, 2022)

## Hospitalizations

- Unvaccinated people were **6.0 times more likely** to be hospitalized for COVID-19 than fully vaccinated individuals. (December 27, 2021 – January 2, 2022)

## Deaths

- Unvaccinated people were **17.8 times more likely** to die from COVID-19 than fully vaccinated individuals. (December 20, 2021 – December 26, 2021)

Interval between primary series and booster is now **5 months** for Pfizer (age 12+) and Moderna (age 18+), 2 months for J&J

# Testing Sites

## CHC testing options:

- CHC patients - call Navigation Center (866) 614-4636
- Non-CHC patients, must call ahead for appointment
  - CHC Templeton – Wednesdays (805)542-6700
  - CHC Fair Oaks (Arroyo Grande) – Fridays (805)270-1700

## Free Community Testing Sites (PCR):

- Avg 5 days for results. Valencia Lab inundated.



# Federal Testing Updates

## COVIDtests.gov

- **Four** free at-home tests can be shipped to each home through the new Federal COVIDtests.gov program
- Health insurance not required

## Insurance reimbursement for over-the-counter tests

- Eight tests per month per individual on the plan
- More information at [cms.gov](https://www.cms.gov)

*If your plan has set up a network of convenient options such as pharmacies and retailers, in which individuals can get their tests' cost covered up front (at the point of sale) then the plan is permitted to limit the reimbursement for tests purchased outside of their network to \$12 per test (or the actual price of the test, if less than \$12). If more than one test is purchased or ordered at a time, such as a package with two tests in it, then the insurer would reimburse up to \$12 for each of the tests purchased at that time.*

# Treatment

- Monoclonal antibody treatment supply is limited and can vary day-to-day.
- Because supply is limited, health care providers are following NIH guidelines and only providing treatment to patients most at-risk.


