

Weekly Vaccine Shipments to SLO County Public Health*







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


Vaccine Administered in SLO County (by Organization)

Blueprint Tier Framework Upon Meeting Statewide Vaccine Equity Metric Goals

- California reached Goal #1 last week
- 2 Million doses administered to lowest HPI quartile census tracts (assessed statewide)

Doses administered in the Vaccine Equity Quartile (statewide)	Tier 1 Widespread (Purple)	Tier 2 Substantial (Red)	Tier 3 Moderate (Orange)	Tier 4 Minimal (Yellow)
Less than 2 million doses administered	Case Rate > 7	Case Rate 4 - 7	Case Rate 1 - 3.9	Case Rate < 1
Goal #1: 2 Million administered	Case Rate > 10	Case Rate 4 - 10	Case Rate <u>1</u> - 3.9	Case Rate < 1
Goal #2: 4 Million doses administered	Case Rate > 10	Case Rate 6 - 10	Case Rate 2 - 5.9	Case Rate < 2

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Mobile Solutions

- Homeless (sheltered and unsheltered)
- Long Term Care Facilities (newly admitted, unlicensed facilities, missed units)
- Homebound
- English as 2nd language
- Behaviorally impacted
- Sober Living Facilities, SUD Residential
- Geographically isolated without transportation
- Low-income/Public Housing



Considerations for Use of Janssen Vaccine

CDPH provided guidance encouraging prioritization of J&J for persons who are:

- Difficult to find and/or not likely to return for 2nd dose
- Without a medical home; harder for follow-up contact
- With limited transportation
- Homebound
- Afraid of adverse events
- Incarcerated or detained
- Experiencing homelessness



Currently Eligible

- SLO County residents age 50 and older
- Workers in:
 - Education and Childcare
 - Food and Agriculture
 - Emergency Services
 - Public Transit
 - Janitorial Services (incl. housekeeping in hotels)
- Residents at high risk because of certain severe medical conditions or severe high-risk disabilities
- Residents who live or work in a homeless shelter or behavioral health facility.




Local Considerations

- Currently vaccinating 50-64
- Next age interval?
- Or open to all?



SLO County Census Totals by Age Group



Informed Guess: Current Herd Immunity (estimations)

Total population	280,000
Adult population	230,000
Fully vaccinated	40,000
Known COV +	20,000
CDPH antibody study (30% Central Coast)	84,000
Adjusted for overlap with Vax and COV + (25%??)	103,000
Toward Herd Immunity	35-40%
Herd Immunity among Adult Population	Approx. 45%
